CRICKET SEASON REVIEW

In the DVCA senior competition, Banyule was proud to field 4 senior teams, (Money Shield, D, F1 & G1 Grades).

In the DVCA vets competition (over 40's), Banyule was proud to field 4 vets teams, (Vets A, Vets B, Vets C and Vets D Grades).

In the DVCA junior competition, Banyule was proud to field 9 junior teams, (U18s, U16s, U14s (x2), U12s Competition (x4) and U12s Development (x1)).

The club also ran another very successful Milo In2Cricket Program (ages 5-9) and T20 Blast Program (ages 9-11).

66 players represented the Club in the 4 senior grades during the season. 20 players (30%) represented the Club in Money Shield Grade, 28 players (42%) in D Grade, 32 players (48%) in F1 Grade and 26 players (39%) in G1 Grade.

New players to represent the Club in senior grades were: Jack Stannard, Jeremy Hannan, Thomas Gaskin, James McIntyre, Gavin Cochrane, Daryl Kennedy, Rod Ebbage, Alistair Howell & Marcus Patamia

69 players represented the Club in the 4 vets' grades during the season.

118 players represented the Club in the 9 junior grades during the season. 12 players in U/18's, 15 players in U/16's, 29 players in the two U/14 teams, 50 players in the four U/12 Competition teams and 12 players in the U/12 Development team.

Over 100 kids participated on Saturday mornings in either the club's Milo In2Cricket (ages 5-9) and T20 Blast (ages 9-11) programs.

This totals 353 players who represented the Banyule Cricket Club across Seniors, Vets, Juniors, Milo In2Cricket & T20 Blast, an amazing achievement!!

TREASURERS REPORT & FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BANYULE CRICKET CLUB INC,

The final result for the financial year ending 30 April 2017 was a surplus of \$2,652. This is a \$7,219 decrease on the previous financial year surplus of \$9,871.

Revenue

Membership revenue increased by \$1,470. The increase is largely due to:

- More vets teams; and
- Annual increase in membership rates.

Bar and Canteen recorded a \$16,541 gross margin, operating at 58% margin. This is an increase from last year, and can be largely attributed to increased level of purchases and increased margin rate from last year.

Corporate Sponsorship was down by \$1,689 from last year, while **Social Revenue** was also up by \$6,241 from last year. Increase in Social Revenue was achieved due increased in profitability of social functions, with \$2500 draw, trivia night and iPod shuffle all proving highly successful.

Expenses

Crickets expenditure was \$7,901 higher than last year. This is largely due to higher ball costs from more teams and finals, more equipment purchases, and higher player/coaching spending.

Capital expenditure related the payment from the Council for replacement pitch on main oval. This has not yet been invoiced by Council, and is expected to be paid next season.

Last season's playing shirts were paid for in this financial year, and water bills for last year were also paid this year.

These are costs that should have been included in last year's result, accounting for the majority of the movement between seasons surpluses.

I'd like to send a big thank you to anybody who helped me along the way with running to the bank to get change, captains who were always chasing me to give me money, and everyone who paid their membership and everyone on the committee for their great work. While we didn't have the on-field success this season (except our glorious Vets side), it wasn't through a lack of effort. We are building something, and the entire committee is to be commended for the strategy and vision they have put in place to set us up for many years of success.

Looking forward to another successful season on and off the field.

Junior Report 2016-17

The Banyule Cricket Club juniors program went from strength to strength in the 2016/17 season. Junior numbers continued to grow and for the first time ever the club fielded 9 teams, a remarkable achievement when you consider that many other clubs have seen a drop off in participation numbers.

109 junior players turned out for the club this season (up from 97 last season) which included 33 new players. With the explosion of junior numbers at our club recently we were in the position of having to play 8 games on Friday nights. Eight games do not go into 2 grounds so most of the U12 teams did it tough this season playing home games away from Banyule. I thank those players and parents for their forbearance and reassure them that it does get better. Fixturing is the responsibility of the DVCA and they did a great job finding grounds for us to play on this season. The committee is getting on the front foot for season 2017/18 and are in negotiations with the DVCA to try to get the best outcome for our teams. There is a possibility that some lower grade U12 competitions will be run on Wednesday nights next season to help alleviate this issue.

Thanks to the parents who cooked sausages for the innings break, who scored for their teams, who umpired, who lugged their kids around in peak hour traffic and who supported our social functions.

Thank you to the wonderful team managers who sent me through their team sheets each match and who made the coaches jobs a lot easier.

Thanks, of course, to the coaches who do a great job for our children and for the club. A special mention to Paul Davis who was awarded the Marty Veal Memorial Shield this season for services to Banyule junior cricket over a long period of time.

Finally, a special thanks to club president Graham Clapton who is amazing for this club and is a ferocious advocate for the juniors and to James McIntyre who keeps the administration of the juniors running like a well-oiled machine.

We kept talking to the boys all year about turning the strike over and building partnerships while keeping the score board ticking over. The most exciting partnership of the year came against Hurstbridge with Darcy and Josh coming together late in the innings - they played their shots, turned the strike over and ran well between the wickets turning ones into twos - and seeing the team chase down the total with two balls to spare.

The award this year went to Darcy Mills with an average of 32.8 and total runs of 164

We didn't feature in the finals but we did give each player an opportunity with the bat and ball throughout the year and we were competitive in most games - the philosophy was on improvement and education.

A good year with continued development of the future senior players at Banyule.
