PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Wow, what a season. With Covid hitting Australia we were wondering if a cricket season would actually take place with numerous webinars with Cricket Victoria and other authorities painting an extremely difficult position. But we got there with a revised fixture of one day games. With all the obstacles in place our club was in a good place to keep us all safe, thanks to the behind the scenes work of Brad Bowler and Rod Ebbage our Covid Officers.

We once again fielded 6 senior teams, 3 Vets and with an increase to our junior program taking it to 18 Junior teams. This growth continues to amaze, as we see other clubs struggling to maintain numbers but it can only be achieved by the hard work of many volunteers starting at our Woolworths Blaster program and into our juniors which funnel into our seniors. There are too many to thank for their efforts in this forum, so I will just say thank you, as your contributions do not go unnoticed.

As we are all aware our Senior Coach for the past 3 Seasons Henry Tyler shall not be continuing in the role and I would like to express our gratitude to Henry for the work he has done with our players, both Junior and Senior. With Henry's guidance we now sit in Barclay Shield with our 2nds and 3rds in B and C Grade respectively. This places our club in prime position to be a force within the DVCA, so to you Henry thank you and we wish you all the best in the future.

Off field Covid did have its impacts with limited functions being able to be organised which caused headaches for our Social Co-Ordinator Tom Elmer but the functions that we were able to run were successful and well received, thank you Tom.

We also expected to take a significant financial hit with Covid impacting small business but we bucked the trend which for a large club is extremely important so that we can maintain financial viability. The financial support of local business cannot be underestimated but the members of the club need to support these businesses where ever possible for 12 months and not just during cricket season, so to all our club financial partners thank you.

We continue to apply for grants which help to strengthen the clubs balance as we purchase equipment etc to improve the clubs resources. This season the focus was obviously on Covid Hygiene materials and I must thank the Victorian Government for approving applications and for providing ongoing financial support to local community clubs as we all fought the pandemic together.

This was further enhanced by the Watsonia RSL granting \$10,000 to install the black safety rubber to our nets to reduce the possibility of ricochets into unsuspecting players as well as maintaining the condition of the balls which is a huge cost to the club. With the funds raised from the Toyota Good for Cricket raffle we hope to cover all the exposed concrete with synthetic grass.

To the committee ,thank you for your hard work during these difficult times, having to operate a club with 425 registered members is a task that goes unnoticed by many and we had our fair share of challenges which we got right most of the time.

With Scott, Fraser and Tom announcing that they shall not be continuing in their roles I would like to thank them for their work in supporting me and the club. In particular Scott, he took on the role as a young person when the clubs financial position was questionable and after 8 years as treasurer has left the club in a strong financial position. While his monthly committee meetings left a lot to be desired we knew that the purse strings were tightly wound and that good control was in place. He also brought a good perspective on how best the club should proceed with all matters both on and off the field. We wish him all the best of luck in his future endeavours.

Next season is possibly going to be one of our most challenging seasons for some time with the loss of the Beverley Rd oval due to councils program of refurbishing oval surfaces and seeing us having to relocate to Banyule Flats for our Firsts and Seconds and possibly Thirds and Fourths and Vets. Our clubrooms will remain our home base but the logistics will cause some difficulties, so we ask that you be prepared for some inconveniences during the time of transition as it's only for one season.

Our club is in a strong position thanks to the support of the membership both young and older and we must not think it will just continue to happen as if we do we will most surely let the hard work go unrewarded.

Thank you to all for their support and continuing to make Banyule a strong, diverse and family friendly club.

TREASURER'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BANYULE CRICKET CLUB INC,

The final result for the financial year ending 30 April 2021 was a surplus of \$34,513. This is a \$29,519 increase on the previous financial year surplus of \$4,994.

Revenue

Membership revenue increased by \$10,864. The increase is largely due to:

- Increase in number of senior playing members
- Increase in junior sides
- Annual increase in membership rates.

*Vets is total Vets membership takings divided by full season membership rate of \$100. In 2020/21, due to shorter season, we would have had more players, but lower total membership takings.

Bar and Canteen recorded a \$4,035 gross margin, operating at 16% margin. This is an increase from last year, driven by a number of factors, including:

- Timing of handover stock – sold to football club at end of season but not purchase from them due to no handover last year after cancellation of 2020 football season
- Lower volume due to shorter season and attendance due to Covid

Sponsorship was up by \$5,682 from last year, driven by an increased focus from the newly formed sponsorship sub-committee. **Social Revenue** was up by \$1,450 from last year. Increase in Social Revenue was largely due to lower attendance at \$2500 draw despite all tickets sold (requires less free drinks and food).

Expenses

Cricket expenditure was \$2,799 lower than last year, largely due to the cancellation of pre-season indoor sessions due to Covid.

Ground hire costs were not paid this year, as Council provided relief as a part of Covid support. However, last year's bill was not received until this year, so total ground hire costs were higher than last year as a result. Utilities, bar and cleaning staff and general maintenance costs were all far lower this season as a result of the shorter season.

This was a season unlike any season we had encountered before. Congratulations on everyone who participated, and everyone who helped make sure the season ran successfully. Thanks to all the captains who manage weekly collection of umpire fees for me, and to the Junior Committee on making the collection of junior membership such a well-oiled machine.

Looking forward to seeing cricket return to normal in 2021/22.

THE GRAEME RENSHAW MEDAL

Graeme made his 1st XI debut in 1963-64 when the club was known as Rosanna Presbyterians. We had the experience of Alex Lewis who was a fantastic asset on field, and provided a wealth of knowledge and assistance off. He was able to build a great rapport with everyone quickly and was a great find for Banyule this season.

Brent O'Connor starred with the bat and ball again, proving that he is still one of the best in the competition and a Banyule legend, and growth and development in Nick Murray's leadership was shown as he took charge of the T20's once again.

Our First XI finished 3 runs short of a Grand Final berth in Barclay Shield, and our second XI also played in a preliminary final but fell short. Other sides also were involved late in the year which reflected well on the effort players put in.

It was a season like no other. It was unpredictable and tiring however it made it very rewarding at the end to be in the presence of finals and each other's company once again.

The club is once again in a fantastic position going into the 2021/22 season.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT - PLAYING REPORTS

The season of 2020-21 certainly looked much different than anything previously experienced. With Covid19 restrictions in place, training was a near solitary pursuit or one where small groups utilised local facilities at various times during the week. Fitness and skill acquisition therefore became more player driven than ever before. A particular noteworthy endeavour was that of breaking the playing group in to four competing teams and competing for points along a number of cricket and fitness related activities. These were conducted away from formally organised sessions at Banyule on regular training nights and also included players partners which generated much enthusiasm as the season commenced.

A start to the season in mid-November was one of many decisions the DVCA were asked to make and this took care of the traditional October rain interruptions. Fixtures were also very different with the season across all grades comprising of one day games only (40 overs for higher grades and 35 overs for F Grade and below). Nobody could be absolutely sure we were prepared for what lay ahead but we shared doubts with all other clubs in that space.

As things transpired only one scheduled weekend was cancelled and the DVCA are again to be commended for the flexibility they adopted in ensuring that nearly all games were played. The preponderance of limited over games it could be argued is to the detriment of some players overall participation and tally of runs and wickets. Ultimately however we all should have felt fulfilled to have had six senior grades play roughly 90 games over the course of the season.

Fielding six senior grades and requiring selection every week asked a lot of the respective captains and the chairman. Player availability was at times variable and is an area that increasingly is where all clubs find themselves challenged as the concept of a 12 game a year player is a rarity (particularly in the lower grades). An excellently organised junior program with willing youngsters and a wide network of past and part time players meant we always fielded full sides and this did Brad Bowler as chairman, and the captain's enormous credit.

Our training numbers throughout the season would have been viewed with envy by other DVCA clubs and must have tested the organisational capacities of Henry Tyler and his assistants. The strength in playing numbers and the commitment to train drove a healthy level of competitiveness and with that results followed. To have 5 of the 6 senior sides play finals was an enormous achievement, particularly in view of the fact that many XI's often were playing rivals higher XI's in their respective grades (C Grade and below).

Promotion for the 1st XI to Barclay Shield under Henry Tyler brought with it a great many unknowns and a great many challenges. We ultimately finished 3rd at the end of the home and away season and were eliminated in a close fought and fluctuating preliminary final against Riverside by just 2 runs. From the successful 2019-20 Money Shield premiership side Jake Smith and Grant McInerney were gone. Additionally Jeremy Hannan did not play beyond Round 4 and injuries to Nick Murray and Brent O'Connor tested the depth of the club yet challenges were nearly always met and the nature of some of the victories was a most pleasing aspect.

The season commenced well with successive victories over perennial Barclay Shield powerhouses in Epping and Riverside. This calmed nerves around the club and should have given the group a degree of confidence yet three losses then followed. The game leading in to the mid-season break therefore became an important one. What followed was a convincing win over the reigning Barclay premiership club Heidelberg which got the team back to 3-3.

The other side of the mid-season break followed the trend set with three wins from the next six games played. Two of those wins were particularly uplifting with the team defending 96 against Riverside and then defeating Rosanna with whom a healthy rivalry still remains though we had not played against them since 2012-13. It then came down to the final weekend in February and two games scheduled across this weekend. Win them both and we were assured of finals. What followed were arguably our two most convincing performances accounting for regular finalist Diamond Creek and then a highly motivated and relegation threatened Plenty. Banyule were finals bound. A large crowd at Banyule saw us chase 132 in the last over against Rosanna to win the semi-final before a preliminary final loss to Riverside.

The one day format perhaps rewarded sides strong in all-rounders and bowling and it was felt that this played to our strengths. In Brent O'Connor (429 Runs & 26 Wkts) we have arguably the most consistent and impactful all-rounder in the DVCA. Nick Murray (269 Runs @ 22.4 & 18 Wkts) continues to post good numbers and Jeff Wilson's economical and at times unrewarded bowling coupled with sensible mid to lower order batting contributions were invaluable.

The batting as mentioned leant heavily on Brent O'Connor (429 @ 39) who posted six scores exceeding 40. Opener Joel Crook (364 @ 26) put a price on his wicket and laid a solid platform for others. Henry Tyler (274 @ 19.7) and Bailey Neilson (175 @ 21.9) also made valuable contributions highlighted by their respective semi-final innings. Henry also had an excellent year behind the stumps with 31 dismissals (27/4).

The bowling was potentially an area of concern at the outset of the season with some deficiencies to cover from 2019-20. These losses were however more than offset by the inclusion of leg spinning Alex Lewis (22 @ 15.4) and Jeff Wilson (13 @ 22.7) to complement Brent O'Connor (26 @ 10.5), Nick Murray (18 @ 15.2) and super consistent Michael Hannan (20 @ 20.6).

Of the younger players Bailey Neilson was particularly impressive in the finals and has a lot of scope for improvement. Jack Arandt dominates at the level below and is also not far away from cracking it at 1st XI level. Congratulations should also go out to Darcy Mills, Jeremy Mahar, Alex Lewis and Callum Asbury who all made their 1st XI debuts for the club during the season.

The 2nd XI under the leadership of Ryan Batchelder was a bit of an unknown quantity at the outset having secured B Grade promotion without a premiership. Like the 1st XI they too perhaps exceeded expectations by making finals. The challenge as always for a club 2nd XI is to gain results at the same time having the depth of talent ready to compete at 1st XI level.

At the mid-year break the side had won 3 of their 6 games and were thereabouts albeit with a fluctuating form line. What happened from here however was a consistent run of results and they were to lose only one further game until the final round where finals participation was already assured. A semi-final victory over Lalor on the back of an excellent Jack Arandt 100 was followed by a comprehensive defeat in the preliminary final to Riverside and 3rd place finish.

The batting was not the strongest aspect of the side. Perhaps the condensed nature of 40 over cricket did not punish the side as it might normally. Jack Arandt (263 @ 43.8) was the standout. Ryan Batchelder (230 @ 20.9) scored quickly in the lower middle order and Daryl Kennedy (198 @ 18) batted sensibly and in support of others throughout.

The bowling effort was highlighted by Josh Neilson (28 @ 12) who had an extraordinary first year at the level. But for a quirk in the DVCA qualification he would have also comfortably won the DVCA award. He consistently took wickets as demonstrated by a strike rate of a wicket roughly every 18 balls. The spread of wickets were fairly even behind Josh with Tom Elmer (18 @ 18.5) bowling with consistency and economy up front. Spencer Veal (15 @ 13.8) and Callum Asbury (11 @ 13) also performed well in between 1st XI appearances.

Importantly this XI gained further exposure to a more intense level of cricket than they had experienced in previous seasons which will be of long term benefit to the club.

The 3rd XI under Steve Pinner found themselves promoted to C Grade and often in competition with other teams 2nd XI's. That they entered the second last round of the season with a chance to play finals was a very creditable scenario. Unfortunately the loss to a lowly Macleod cruelled any finals ambitions. After a thumping first round loss the side was able to win its next four games. Stronger games then awaited and with it came four successive defeats. A mini rebound followed before the year ended with two losses.

There were some individual batting highlights during the season but invariably and expectedly those players were promoted. Justin Poyser (215 @ 43) was the leading run scorer and by the end of the season found himself in the 1st XI as did Lucas Willoughby (92 @ 92). Of those that played regularly Joel Perugini (171 @ 14.3) turned around a slow start adapting to the level as an opening bat and Michael Johnson (171 @ 21.4) contributed well floating throughout the order.

With the ball Zac Brown (18 @ 18.2) had an excellent first season at the level and showed his continued development after winning the 4th XI bowling award the previous season. Connor Lennox (12 @ 22.4) bowling fastish off spin also showed ability at the level and had a taste of 2nd XI cricket along the journey. Michael Johnson, Philip Barnes and James McIntyre bowled economically throughout and with their collective experience assisted enormously in the development of the youngsters at the bowling crease.

This side had 29 players play through the year which whilst providing opportunities at a good grade of cricket is perhaps a few too many to ensure consistency of results. A related quirk was the use of 8 separate wicketkeepers across the 13 fixtures.

The 4th XI under Michael Delaney played in F1 and were to be the highest ranked of all of our XI's by home and away victories. Unfortunately the wins stopped there and with it aspirations to get this XI in to E Grade. The 'Peoples XI' was generally a more experienced side than their opponents and this assisted in a number of

close results that went our way. This was particularly highlighted with three post mid-year break wins all being decided in the last over. These wins coupled with a run of four successive early season victories had finals front of mind and it came down to ladder position as to where those finals might be.

The batting was able to score the right type of runs for one day cricket. Michael Delaney (230 @ 19.2) and Dale Rodda (170 @ 21.3) scored quickly in the mid order. This followed the enterprising opening forays of Matthew Lewis (349 @ 26.9) who so often set an impressive platform. Where trouble was encountered, Paul Davis (243 @ 27) marshalled a response and with that results followed.

With the ball Flynn Davis (21 @ 14.2) was superb in what was his first full year of senior cricket. He visibly grew in confidence with each game and was able to sample C grade cricket with success as well. Young Jaxon McIntyre (12 @ 21.7) was given encouragement and developed along the way in a format that may have challenged him at the outset. Luke Delaney (18 @ 16.8) when not hitting long bombs or taking hat tricks, was as spirited as ever, and Paul Davis (13 @ 14.3) again showed the value of a simple outlook to whatever he did. Matthew Lewis with 21 wicket keeping dismissals (15/6) also gave the side a lot of structure.

That the side did not play in a Grand Final came down to a controversial semi-final run out adjudication leading to a 'losing' tie against Lower Eltham. In the preliminary final Lower Plenty were able to call on players from higher XI's who were not finals tied and they comfortably accounted for a Banyule side that was perhaps still absorbing the disappointment of the preceding day.

The 5th XI under the leadership of Alistair Howell played in G1 grade and were extremely unlucky not to win the grand final against what was a Bundoora Park 3rd XI. After starting the year in a promising manner with two wins, the side experienced three successive losses against what were to be the other finalists at year end. Only one other loss followed though a washout and Covid sit out against higher ranked sides at the time helped with ladder positioning. A number of narrow wins when key players were absent meant that when finals rolled around confidence was high.

A narrow semi-final loss against the run away leading side of Bundoora Park was followed by a thumping preliminary final win over Old Paradians to set up a re-match against Bundoora Park. Unfortunately injury to valuable all-rounder in Dave Veal was costly and the 4th XI losing their preliminary final 'unqualified' a further two players. Amazingly Alistair found himself scratching around to fill a side around school cricket commitments and those that were surprisingly reluctant to play. When the game did begin an excellent 100 plus opening contributed to a score of 4-164 which should have been enough. What followed was some wayward bowling (23 wides) when our opposition only bowled two and a final over defeat.

The batting was led by experienced pair Brett Oliver (396 @ 99) and Gavin Cochrane (378 @ 29.1). Both were remarkably consistent with Brett scoring over 40 runs in 7 of his 9 innings and Gavin scoring over 25 in 6 successive games. In the grand final the pair put together a 116 run opening partnership and Gavin's 86 was a fantastic innings. Liam Sier (75 @ 25), Jack Veal (96 @ 48), Will Waters (58 @ 19.3), James Heaney and Daniel Murray all at some point made valuable contributions in tight games. All can and will play higher.

With the ball Anish Jadhav (7 @ 15.2) and David Veal (6 @ 25) bowled with excellent economy and formed a good opening partnership. Anish is an U14 player who experienced a taste of 4th XI cricket and showed much promise and maturity. Daniel Murray (11 @ 29.7) whether bowling speed or spin was very invested, and Lindsay Russell (14 @ 21.1) again shone at the level and was reliable throughout. Alistair Howell (8 @ 17) when encouraged to bowl was a wily contributor.

The 6th XI played in G2 grade and were led by Rod Ebbage (pre calf injury) and then Garrick Melton. The side was a mix of talented young kids on the rise, older and experienced cricketers returning to cricket, and others that are relatively new to cricket.

At the mid-year break the team was well placed having won four of 6 games. After the break the side was to win a further three games to ensure a 4th placed finish. Whilst bleeding lots of young cricketers they remained competitive against all teams apart from the two who played in the grand final. They were clearly too good for the grade, playing eleven senior cricketers every week, whilst most other teams had a balance of older guys and juniors.

The batting was led by the consistent Andy Hetherington (319 @ 39.9) and a fast scoring Marcus Jones (205 @ 34.2). They were ably supported by Darren Mills (194 @ 21.6) and Garrick Melton (151 @ 50.3). Juniors James Heaney and Nathanael Hetherington also had good moments. Of the bowlers Darren Mills (9 @ 18.8) and Grayson Morel (13 @ 19.2) led the way. Juniors Nick Aston and Ollie Mills both 7 wickets and Ollie in particular bowled with great economy throughout. Rod Ebbage (104 runs and 7 wickets) performed well and was a big absence at the back end of the year.

Highlights centered around the thirteen junior players that had their first taste of senior cricket. This also included those players that got to play with their fathers which has been a continuing feature of this XI since its inception. As always the leadership shown (on field or organizationally) by the senior cricketers was both required and gratefully received. An individual highlight was Grayson Morel taking his first ever catch in senior cricket which was captured on video and gleefully shared around the club. The manner in which Garrick Melton stood up to lead this side after Rod's injury was greatly appreciated by those he played with.

A feature of having six senior XI's is the ability to transition enthusiastic juniors to senior cricket for the first time. Our junior players and participation rates as mentioned previously are looked upon with envy by others. Not only are our numbers good but the abilities of some of these players stands out. We should be proudly aiming for these players to maintain their enthusiasm and to progress quickly through the grades as their talent develops further.
