CRICKET SEASON REVIEW

<u>Club</u>

In season 2008-09, in the HDCA the Club fielded 4 senior teams in A, B, C and D grades as well as 8 junior teams. Junior teams fielded were one team in the Under 17's, two Under 15's, two Under 13's and three Under 11 Kookaburra teams. In 2008-09 season the HDCA moved to odd junior age groups from even previously and our junior team numbers increased by one team over previous season which was pleasing.

<u>Senior</u>

69 players represented the Club in senior grades during the season down slightly from 72 previous year. There were 17 (25%) players who represented the Club in A Grade, 26 (38%) in B Grade, 32 (46%) in C Grade and 27 (39%) in D Grade. To have 3 great players such as Ocka, Rowdy and Joff at the Club allows us the opportunity to remain competitive in A-Grade whist developing our next group of A-Grade stars.

Thanks must go to our **Senior Coaching panel**, Darren Butterworth (Butters), Ocka and Daniel Barnes (DLo) who combined, ensured that training was an enjoyable place to be and provided excellent leadership after taking over from Joffa early in the season. Unfortunately Jeff had to relinquish the coaching and captaincy role due to personal circumstances but his work early in the season helped set the scene for the senior players and the direction the club took on developing our own talent. Further his continued leadership and performance on-field was a key factor in winning the A-Grade flag.

Thank you also goes to the **Senior Captains** Brent O'Connor / Jeff Wilson (A-Grade), Michael Johnson (B-Grade), Scott Butler (C-Grade) and Graham Clapton (D-Grade) for their work as the senior leadership group and for all their work including looking after the cricket kits, putting up shade tents, cleaning-up, attending the Thursday night selection meetings etc. Congratulations and thank you to you all.

Our Juniors did not have quite the success we have experienced in the past but we had 8 junior teams plus our first Milo "In-2-Cricket" group. Plenty of our Junior players represented the HDCA in 2008-09 and there were some really good performances in what was a season heavily interrupted by the weather.

Thank you to the best **Junior Manager** in the HDCA, Geoff Place (Jed) who combined beautifully his role as our Junior Manager with his role as HDCA Junior coordinator. Once the last of the Place boys leave the Junior ranks we may have some really big shoes to fill.

Thanks also go to all the **Junior coaches** who volunteered some much time to training the junior players and managing match days. A present is provided to the Junior coaches each year however this is only a small token of the Club's appreciation for the work they do.

I would particularly like to thank **Brad Bowler** who coordinated and ran our first Milo "In-2-Cricket" program. Brad did a lot of work to organise the Saturday morning program and it was great to see the girls and boys of some of our former champs such as Greg Anderson, Marty Veal, Andrew Parry and Paul Carroll getting their first taste of cricket at Banyule.

Importantly I want to recognise the contribution of the **Sponsors** of the Banyule Cricket Club in 2008-09. TREASURER'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BANYULE CRICKET CLUB INC.

The final result for the year ended 30 April 2009 was a profit of \$2,042 (\$3,321 profit 07-08). Another strong performance for the club following a successful 07-08.

Key items affecting the result for 08-09 are as follows:

- Increase in membership levels. This is mainly due to our successful junior program.
- This season we had a decrease in sponsorship of the club. While our corporate sponsorship continued to be successful, we had a significant drop in player sponsors.
- Less social functions and lower attendances this season saw a significant drop in fundraising.
- Bar/Canteen turnover increased on last season. This is mainly due to the home finals in A Grade.
- Cleaning costs increased on last season due to requirement of extra cleaning and cleaning supplies.
- On line annual reports provided savings to the club.

Due to a decrease in interest rates, we have been able to reduce the term of the loan with the council by keeping the repayments at the same level. This has seen a decrease of 7 months from October 2011 to March 2011, representing a saving of \$2,121 to the club. The committee also purchased a new scoreboard for the High School oval, slips cradle and rebound stump to improve training quality.

Once again the social scene was lower than expected. This was impacted by the amount of cricket being played, which reduced the amount of time available to have functions. Next year should see more time available for functions which should see an increase in this area.

The committee investigated the opportunity to upgrade the nets this season, unfortunately the council had already committed their funds to other facilities. We will revisit this again next season. We will also need to upgrade the pitch on the high school oval in the next few seasons.

Once again thank you to our sponsors for their continued support of the club. It certainly makes my job easier having the long term sponsors we do. Thanks also to Daniel Barnes for organising all the sponsors, promoting their businesses and keeping contact with them all.

This year we moved to a new bar supplier, the Tower Hotel, who also became a sponsor. This turned out to be a huge success in what will hopefully be a long term deal. Thanks to Scott Butler for organising the bar and canteen stock, general upkeep of the bar and usually locking up the club. The success of the Bar/Canteen is due to all the hard work you put in. Thanks also to his Saturday helpers, Ando, Plugga, John Veal, Ash Barnes and Brian Smith.

A tough job organising the social scene for the club this season, thanks to Michael Johnson for organising this. Plenty of extra cricket to time away for functions, but the functions we did have we well run and very enjoyable.

Again this season Geoff Place did a stellar job organising the juniors. Jed did all the collection of membership, sale of clothing and banking. All I had to do was update my data with the spreadsheet Jed put together, making it very easy for me. Thanks very much Jed.

Thanks to Ryan Hartnett who collected membership while I was in selection this season. Thanks also to Secretary Phil Barnes for all his work this season. Phil organises quite a lot around the club and always keeps me informed of what's going on so I get no surprises!

Lastly thanks once again to Martin Phillips for all his help during the season. It's handy having a former treasurer as president as he always calls me to ask if we can afford to spend money before he spends it. It takes a lot of work to run the club and Marty does a great job organising and putting it all together. Hopefully next year you don't fold and have too many meetings!

All in all another good season on and off the field, which will keep us going for many premierships to come. Thanks to all the members, family and friends of the BCC for continuing to make us the great club that we are.

SECOND GRADE REPORT

Season Review.

With the change in personnel from within both the 1st and 2nd grade sides from the previous season, the 2008/09 season was going to be a transitional period through the development of the younger brigade from within the two top grades. The outlook taken on the 2nd grade was exactly that, to develop the younger players for the growth of the club across the next 3-5 years, with the results to take care of themselves.

Overall the season can be viewed as a success for the club, not only by the results that we achieved where we were sitting top at the half way point and ended up 3rd in both the One Day Comp and the overall season, but the individual performance's and development of particular players. So to have younger players who either played there first game in the 2nd grade last season or their first one this season, to then go on and represent our first grade is the key measure of success (outside a premiership) that was the most pleasing as captain. Such players as Tom Woodman, Marcus

Kernaghan, Arjun Arora, Matthew Hodges, Sam Norman, Joseph Serafin and Garrick Melton were presented their opportunities in the 1st grade, through both commitment in the pre-season training and their on field performances, which in the years to come will hold the Banyule Cricket Club in good stead.

When focussing on the development of the players within the 2nd grade, certain players showed strength in their character to not only improves as players and their own skills, but as valuable members of the side. Matthew Hodges was certainly one of those, who developed throughout the year as our opening bowler and displayed consistent performances to end up with 17 wickets @17.94 and played his first A grade game later in the year, so well done to Matt.

Mick Delaney also displayed throughout the year that he will be a valuable member of the club moving forward with 12 wickets (inc Hat-trick), 125 runs and 6 catches, which was a good breakout year for which he can build on. Mick's enthusiasm at all times was a great boost to the side and was never more evident then when we were fielding and perhaps the game was not going our way, of which his ability to create pressure through his actions and his vocal support was exceptional and why he was awarded our fielding award. Sticking with the Delaney theme, Luke also had a strong year showing exceptional skills as a wicketkeeper. With 14 catches, 1 stumping and a run out, Luke will develop into a good player for the future, as he can develop his batting into being a good middle order hitter. The highlight was the stumping he took standing up to his brother against Ivanhoe East, which displayed that he is a future 1st grade wicketkeeper.

Other players to mention are Sam Place (167 runs) who opened the batting all year and with further technique adjustments had the ability to put pressure on receiving 1st grade opportunities and Tom Woodman who in his brief appearances showed the ability to be a strong top order batsman with further development and a damaging fieldsmen. As an all-rounder, Marcus Kernaghan in his 9 matches made 186 runs @ 26.57 and took 17 wickets @ 13.06 (inc. his first 5 wicket haul) was also a good performance.

From the team results, the two wins against Edinburgh where the away game was played on the worst conditioned oval seen in a long time and the outright win at home (in front of a fired up Banyule crowd), the dominant away win against Ivanhoe East and the away win against Heidelberg were the real highlights.

Although we were clearly outplayed by an experienced outfit in the semi-final, the 2nd grade team and all of those involved throughout the year can be proud of their performance and come out more prepared for what's ahead next season knowing where we need to for strengthen our performances.

I would like to say as captain, I thoroughly enjoyed the year and the opportunity presented too me in leading such a committed team throughout the year. To Paul Davis who was my Vice Captain for the first half of the year, until his outstanding performances with the bat and ball demanded he be selected in the 1st grade, thank you very much. Prior to being promoted, PD took 17 wickets @ 15.71, 8 catches and made 308 runs @ 44.00 to take out the batting average and was once again dominating the competition.

Thank you very much to Marty Phillips who consistently provided support and advice in PD's absence and in his role as club President, the support provided by the coach in Darren Butterworth

and the 1st Grade captain in Brent O'Connor, along with the things that others don't see from Phillip Barnes in ensuring the scores are entered onto the website and various other items.

Let's build and develop on what was a good season for not only individuals, but the team and the Banyule Cricket Club.
