CRICKET SEASON REVIEW

In season 2015-16 the Club was proud to field 4 senior teams in the Diamond Valley Cricket Association (DVCA). Teams participated in Money Shield, C, D & G Grades.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

In my first year as standalone President I have come to appreciate the work involved in striving to make our club the best place to be, not just on the field but also off field. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Michael Asbury for the past 5 years as President as well as thank all committee members for their support and encouragement.

Our season started with the appointment of Ryan Hartnett as senior coach and first grade captain which we all acknowledged was a huge commitment for Ryan to take on and he has shown the ability to handle the pressures placed upon him in fulfilling these dual roles, and I thank him for that. Ryan has agreed to continue as senior coach for the 2016/2017 season so that he can continue to implement the plans that we have put in place to not only move our club forward but to give the opportunity to our players to get the best out of themselves but most of all to enjoy their time at Banyule.

This season we have embarked on areas that we have never considered previously and this was in the area of applying for grants to allow us to purchase items that would otherwise have to be raised through fundraising activities. We applied to the Banyule Council for a \$10,000 grant for a shade shelter on the back oval and were granted \$5000 toward the building of the structure .We needed more for this to become a reality, and with the help of some budding Oscar award winners we were successful with our application to Holden for an additional \$10,000 to allow for the purchase to go ahead. I would like to take this opportunity to thank and acknowledge the contributions of Banyule Council and Holden and by extension Ralph D'Silva Holden Preston for their contribution as these commitments allow not for profit community based clubs like ours to improve facilities so that we can make our time at the club a bit more enjoyable as well as for those after us. As an outcome of our success with the Holden Grant Ralph D'Silva Holden have agreed to sponsor the club next season and hopefully onwards. I would also like to acknowledge Vogue Pergolas who will install the structure once council have completed all the predig applications.

We also applied to Greensborough RSL for a defibrillator which once again we were successful and I would like to thank Greensborough RSL and Banyule Council for awarding such an important piece of equipment for our club especially with our large number of Vets players and watchers.

We were not always successful with all our applications but we will continue to monitor and apply for grants that will help us continue to provide a facility that we can all be proud of. I would like to make it perfectly clear to everybody that the money provided from our grants are not there to top up the clubs bank balance and is all accounted for in the projects and if not utilised for the project must be returned to the provider.

Another area we wanted to build on was with our partnerships and this year we were approached by Bonola Automotive Services as they were looking for a club to support and were of the view that our club fitted their needs. With this partnership we were able to purchase from one of our other partners Concept Partners, new playing shirts for all our junior and senior players so thank you Bonola Automotive for this support and they have agreed to continue this partnership into the future.

I would like to acknowledge and thank our other partners as without their continued support we would have to raise fees etc. to provide you with the equipment and facilities we have become used to so in no particular order thank you Dan Sheean of Hocking Stuart, Peter Adams of Concept Partners, Michael Asbury of Melbourne Restaurants, The Harp of Erin Hotel and Rick Hartnett & Associates. We need to build on this base and if you have anybody in mind that may have an interest no matter how small in supporting your club financially please contact our newly appointed Sponsorship Manager Nick Murray and he will be able to provide you with our proposals.

As our season progressed we then moved into fundraising, firstly was our Casino Royale Night that for those few that attended was a fun night but as it was poorly attended we took a lost on the night. We then had the fundraiser for RUOK because UMatter day which coincided with our matches against Heidelberg. This was an exceptionally successful day for the chosen charity "Camp Magic" and I would like to thank all that were involved as well as thank Heidelberg CC for supporting the event. I have expressed a desire to Heidelberg for this to be an ongoing event and that next season we will reciprocate the same level of support to Heidelberg if they chose to go down the same path and nominate a charity that is of their choice. I also have thanked the DVCA for supporting the event by way of fixturing and have suggested that this could become a competition wide event when a round of cricket is set up to support chosen charities.

Our final club fundraiser was the \$2500 reverse drawer which was well supported by not just our senior club members but by families from our junior groups our Vets and also by Banyule Football Club which is something I have been working on with the football clubs to build on our relationships as we all use the same facilities for the same purpose and that is to represent the Banyule family. I would like to offer a big thank you to Tommy Elmer as our Fundraiser/events manager as he has done a fantastic job and at times under some duress as we were not sure how things would progress.

We are a family club with many families contributing to the clubs history and I am hopeful that we may gain some help from our female group as I believe you will add a different perspective on how the club can improve in the way of engagement of its membership so that when and if a fundraising event takes place it is not the same people always attending. I have also this year engaged more with our past players by regularly emailing them club updates which I have found has been welcomed by many of the players as they were able to be kept up to date with their clubs achievements. One way this was done was via our Howzat newsletter that was put together by Connor Lennox and Nick Murray which

was well received by the past players as well as our club partners as we could use this as way of keeping them in touch with our club. I hope this will continue as it is a great way to advertise our club and its partnerships.

Our U12's and Vets A Grade teams won premierships and I congratulate them on their achievements as we are all jealous of their success.

The future of the club looks bright with a young group gaining experience and the confidence of their abilities as they build on the opportunities they are given to represent our club. We expect numbers to once again be strong for the 2016/2017 season which places the club in a good position to negotiate with council to improve our facilities so that you can perform to your best abilities.

Thank you to the committee for all their work during the year with an extra special thank you to my wife Terri, you have put up with a lot during the past year with most nights my time taken with cricket matters, being making grants applications, attending meetings, writing minutes, dealing with security issues, or just the day to day cricket club administration thank you for your understanding and I can only hope it will get easier.

TREASURERS REPORT & FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BANYULE CRICKET CLUB INC.

The final result for the financial year ending 30 April 2016 was a surplus of \$9,871. This is a \$13,804 increase on the previous financial year deficit of \$3,933.

Revenue

Membership revenue increased by \$2,323. The increase is largely due to:

- Increasing membership prices, which had been frozen for the previous two seasons;
- Increase in junior membership numbers, primarily t20 Blast/in2cricket programs; offset by
- Less senior members, reflected in the increase in junior players filling senior sides.

Bar and Canteen recorded a \$12,096 gross margin, operating at 49% margin. This is a decrease from last year, and can be largely attributed to lower levels of purchasing from previous year, with margin remaining steady from previous year.

Corporate Sponsorship was up by \$2,384 from last year, while **Social Revenue** was also up by \$1,572 from last year. Increase in Social Revenue was achieved due to a profit from \$2500 Draw and pre-season Bunnings BBQ, less loss from Casino Night and donation of bar profits from RUOK Day.

Expenses

Cricket expenditure was \$1,772 lower than last year. This is largely due to carried over ball stock from previous year.

Capital expenditure related the payment of High School Oval Shade Structure, less funding received by not yet spent. This resulted in negative capital for the year. This excess funding is expected to be spent on completion of project.

I would like to say a special thank-you to our new President, Graham Clapton. First year in charge is always challenging, and no doubt he learnt plenty throughout the year that he can build on and improve in coming years.

Finally, a big thank you to anybody who helped me along the way with running to the bank to get change, captains who were always chasing me to give me money, and everyone who paid their membership and everyone on the committee for their great work. While we didn't have the on-field success this season (except our glorious Vets side), it wasn't through a lack of effort. We are building something, and the entire committee is to be commended for the strategy and vision they have put in place to set us up for many years of success.

Looking forward to another successful season on and off the field.

Players

From the very strong numbers of players we had across the Under 12 age group, this side was brought together near the start of the season and comprised of 8 core players. The side was regularly augmented with players from the competitive Under 12 team – massive thanks to Paul Davis for this support.

The DVCA Development program is very sound in its format in that players learn the importance when batting of protecting their wicket and making runs with limited balls to face – however, they know there is a chance to bat again which keeps them engaged throughout the innings.

Quite a few players were top age and playing their first year of cricket – Rohin Das, Mitchell Cargin, Charlie Vincent and Declan Braniff (with Gabriel Lancefield joining for a short while before domestic responsibilities forced the cessation of his playing year). With these boys heading into Under 14 competition next season, there was a strong emphasis on technique development to cope with the stronger boys they may play against in the future. Having the more experienced boys coming over from the PD's team was tremendous as players on the blue team had weekly demonstrations of more mature playing styles.

Players staying within the Under 12 age group next year include Brodie Johnson, Oliver Mills, Jett Bennett, Lachlan McCulloch & Jacob Garrone. Jacob unfortunately was not able to complete the season as he moved schools after Christmas and travel times were against him.

Batting

As the season developed the batting became considerably better in terms of front foot technique and confidence in running. The boys worked on their running particularly hard and benefitted with improved partnership results and a greater sense of team work.

The boys naturally stronger with front foot play were Brodie, Oliver, Rohin, Declan and Mitchell by the end of season. Jett is a prodigiously strong boy whose natural shot is seriously dangerous to anyone fielding close in on the leg side. By the end of the season this natural stroke play was being tempered as bowlers developed their skills and avoided the hitting zones favoured by Jett and he responded with more correct stroke play.

Lachlan by the end of the season developed confidence in running and his stroke play improved dramatically.

Bowling

All boys contributed well with the ball. The focus was to be balanced in their run up, controlled through the delivery stride and targeting spots where the batsman were not comfortable.

Brodie, Oliver, Mitchell, Rohin and Declan were very controlled in their line and length – enjoying the wickets that resulted.

Jett's strength gets him by through pure shoulder bowling. IN the future he will need more work to get him moving through the crease in a manner that gives consistency in line and length. When he was "on" with this bowling, he was extremely damaging.

Lachlan had to work very, very hard on not collapsing as he delivered the ball. He was benefitting from this work by the seasons end and began taking wickets. Hopefully as he grows, his core will strengthen up and support him while bowling to give him greater control.

Fielding

The team enjoyed a heap of run outs through the year. The general engagement in the field after the initial overs were what you would expect from boys this age.

Behind the stumps and as active, engaged fielders, Oliver and Declan were surprisingly the stand outs.

In general

The season was a success in many ways. The strongest competition came from within – in that the Banyule teams were technically stronger and more engaged.

From the players that are remaining in Under 12 next year, Brodie and Oliver would benefit from stronger competition and advanced coaching. Brodie's batting and bowling were advanced for his age. Oliver has enhanced game sense and is quite skilled with bat and behind the stumps.

Of the 5 boys going into Under 14 competition they are prepared for that, however, their ability to cope with the players who are physically stronger and have played cricket for longer will be tested.

MILO In2Cricket & T20 BLAST

Banyule Milo in2Cricket and T20 Blast

Season 2015/16 saw over 100 young cricketers start or continue their formative cricket life in our Milo in2Cricket and T20 Blast Programs. Our new structure saw both our introductory in2Cricket Program (for 4-7 year olds) and our T20 Blast Program (7-10 yrs) run side by side and at the same time. This allowed for improved convenience for parents with kids in each age group as well setting out clearly our 'Banyule Cricket Pathway' (in2Cricket-T20 Blast-Junior Cricket-Senior Cricket).

Our in2Cricket Program adopted somewhat of an 'Auskick' model in terms of having set coaches each age or school group. We also endeavoured to implement modified cricket games into our skill sessions as often as possible, which provided not only for improved skill development but also saw the kids playing actual games of cricket, which they all loved! Of our 66 enrolled participants, I predict that about half will continue along the pathway to T20 Blast for next season, with the remaining returning for another year of in2Cricket.

Brent O'Connor coordinated all T20 Blast organisation on Saturdays, with four teams playing each other throughout the 12 week season. This was a massive job as Ocka strived to allocate teams equal in terms of ability and considering of friendships whilst dealing with absences or late comers. The improvement that we saw in terms of skills developed both in games and in time spent on the Skills Zone in very exciting for the club's future. I expect to have approximately twenty game ready T20 Blast players transition into our Under 10's teams for season 2016/17.

The feedback that we have received from parents and kids has been very positive and I expect the program to continue to grow next season in terms of both numbers and the overall quality of what we provide. Our focus for season 16/17 will be to encourage more girls to play, particularly in our T20 Blast Program. We are aiming to have enough girls to fill two T20 Blast teams that can play each other every Saturday morning and then continue into any proposed DVCA Junior Girls Cricket Competition in future seasons.

One of the many highlights for the season was the 8 kids who represented Banyule Cricket Club at the lunch break at the Boxing Day Test at the MCG. We also had a number of in2Cricket and T20 Blast players take part in on field activities during the KFC BigBash, which was a big thrill for the kids and their parents as well!
