## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Let's go back to the end of the 20/21 season where we were on the hunt for a new coach and captain. We were steered in the direction of experienced coach Darren Pybus, and after our first meeting it was clear we shared a common philosophy and that Darren was the correct fit for our club. It is also pleasing that Darren has agreed to continue into the 2022/23 season.

Our focus was then toward the appointment of our first grade captain and after much consideration Nick Murray was the chosen one. It was recognised it was an appointment that would provide some frustrations at times, as Nick would be learning the role as he developed through the year. We are confident that Darren and Nick will create a partnership that will develop into positive results for our club and the individual players.

We once again fielded 6 senior, 18 junior and 2 Vets teams but most pleasing was the introduction of our first ever girls team that was looked after by Steve Pinner and Aaron Lambert. The girls had a great year just missing out on finals and from all reports they enjoyed themselves and are looking forward to getting back into it next season.

The DVCA had indicated preseason that it would be hoping to schedule a normal season with 2 day and 1 day fixtures games but unfortunately Covid impacted the season and a 1 day fixtured season was once again thrust upon us. Hopefully 2022-23 sees a return to normal cricket.

Whilst the season may not have produced the success we have become accustomed to, it did provide other on field successes. We had a number of first grade debuts and the success of a number of juniors that were exposed to senior Cricket also occurring. Others had the opportunity to play alongside their parents.

A big thank you to Tim Braddy our Junior Co-Ordinator and all the junior coaches and team managers on another successful season. Our junior program is the envy of many DVCA clubs and without their commitment we would be unable to sustain the numbers and therefore offer the opportunities to take part in the great game of cricket. This culminated in an U12 Blue premierships flag.

The Child Safety Framework for Children and Young People to which Banyule Cricket Club was one of the first clubs within the DVCA to adopt and endorse was introduced. Our involvement was acknowledged by CV for our clubs commitment to providing a safe environment for our children and young players. This shall be continued to be developed as CA introduce updates and changes.

As always being a community not for profit club we value the financial support by our club partners and we truly thank them for their ongoing support. Thank you to our partners Physioliife, Bonola Automotive, Kutrize Hair, Kennedy Air & Plumbing, The Greenery Home & Garden Centre, Placebuilt, Kookaburra, Kavair & MSC Signs. You make operating the largest club in the Heidelberg area that much easier. I must also acknowledge the Victorian State Government, Cricket Australia and Cricket Victoria for its support in making grants funding available and Banyule City Council for their ongoing assistance.

We were fortunate to be able to run a CPR/ Defibrillator course with 14 people associated with the club gaining the skills that hopefully they will never have to use. This course was made available via a Victorian Govt Grant engaging Real Response to deliver the training.

I must thank the members of the committee for their work but especially those that form part of the executive. At times they are the ones that are needed to make the tough and sometimes unpopular decisions. These decisions are made with the clubs best interests at the forefront as we strive to build on a culture that we will be proud of.

An extra thank you to Thea Oliver for providing assistance to new Treasurer Peter Cargin and to Meagan Pinner for her work with merchandise sales and dealing with Kookaburra to provide our quality apparel. This year saw the club invest in capital expenditures that will benefit the players and supporters and we hope to build on this as time goes by.

Next year we're expecting to be relocating teams that play on the Beverley Rd oval to most likely Banyule Flats as Council take on the task of resurfacing the oval. This will provide some inconveniences but once completed we hope will provide a quality surface for many years to come. We shall maintain the Merv Anderson pavilion as our home base so that we continue to have the feeling of "home".

Finally congratulations to all our award winners with Akashdeep Cheema being selected into the DVCA Barclay Shield team of the year which was reward for his consistent year.

Hopefully next season will see cricket back to what we have grown up with and will see more of our young players develop into future stars for our club.

Editor's Note – There were significant works undertaken in completing the synthetic coverings across the whole of the practice wicket apron. It is anticipated this will not only improve the amenity but it will increase player safety and prolong the life of practice balls. Brad Bowler is to be commended for his work in sourcing the materials.

A new and more user friendly bowling machine was purchased and was heavily utilised in the back end of the season by both senior and junior sections of the club. Additionally the club had a concrete pad laid under the shelter at the 'Cabbage Patch' which improved the spectating experience for players and supporters alike.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BANYULE CRICKET CLUB INC,

The final result for the financial year ending 30 April 2022 was a surplus of \$26,301. This is a \$8,213 decrease on the previous financial year surplus of \$34,514.

We also invested \$18,400 into some capital items including a bowling machine, marquee, synthetic grass and a contribution to the concrete slab next to the A J Burkitt Oval. All of these will provide longer term benefits to our club.

### Revenue

**Membership revenue** decreased by \$7,513. The decrease is largely due to:

- decrease in number of senior playing members
- decrease in junior members

There was no increase in the membership rates for FY21/22.

**Bar, Canteen & Dinners** recorded a \$5,372 gross margin. Sales were up on last year due to higher attendances with less Covid restrictions, with an operating margin of 16% which is consistent with last year.

**Sponsorship** was down slightly on last year by \$425 to \$17,685.

**Social Revenue** was down on last year by \$5,300 due to the timing of revenue from the Presentation night last year compared to this year. Also, last year Social revenue included the Toyota Grant of \$2484 which has been allocated to Grant income this year.

**Grant income** of \$6,717 provided some important income during the year. We were fortunate to receive 2 grants totalling \$2500 from the Department of Jobs, Precincts and Regions under the Sporting Clubs Grants program. Also, we received \$3500 from Cricket Australia as part of their Grass Roots funding program. Toyota also contributed \$717. A big shout out to Graham Clapton for facilitating this grant funding on behalf of the club during the year.

### Expenses

**Cricket expenditure** was consistent with last year. We doubled our investment in junior coaching to \$4220, which was offset by lower senior cricket costs.

Buildings and Grounds costs were higher this year as there was no Covid support provided by council, as well as higher utility costs.

Administration costs were slightly higher this year, with the club providing valuable CPR training to a number of members. This was fully funded via the Sporting Club Grants program above.

A fantastic effort by everyone who participated this year. Thanks to all the captains who manage weekly collection of umpire fees and to the Junior and Senior Committee members who ensured the season ran successfully.

Finally, I would personally like to thank Thea Oliver for her fantastic bookkeeping support this year.

Looking forward to a successful cricket season in FY22/23.

## BOARD OF MANAGEMENT - PLAYING REPORTS

With Covid19 restrictions remaining in place, the 2021-22 was to follow a similar theme to 2020-21. The playing group under new coach Darren Pybus were able to meet via such modern communication methods as Zoom and Microsoft Teams. Training was again a logistical challenge even allowing for the fact that the season was again subject to a later start than the traditional first weekend in October. Some limited indoor sessions were held for the likely Shield group but most training endeavours were, like the preceding year where players gathered in small groups and utilised local facilities. The Banyule 'fitness challenge' again saw the playing group break in to four teams and competing for points along a number of cricket and fitness related activities. This initiative that included drafts and incentives again generated much enthusiasm in the lead up to the commencement of the season.

Fixtures for 2021-22 across all grades again comprised one day games only (45 overs for Barclay Shield, 40 overs for B-E grades and 35 overs for F Grade and below). A start to the season in mid-November would appear to have taken care of the traditional early season rain interrupted fixtures yet round 1 was washed out for all senior grades. As things transpired only one scheduled weekend was cancelled and the DVCA are again to be commended for the flexibility they adopted in ensuring that nearly all games were played. The short form games are a laudable and practical attempt by the DVCA to ensure consistency and navigate Covid-19 complications but are not best suited to a club with a large junior component.

With the preponderance of limited over games it could be argued that this is to the detriment of some players overall participation and tally of runs and wickets. Junior cricket saw 20/20 games only and this did not necessarily provide enough 'cricket' for the players. With the numbers of games and players comes challenges around organising training and match planning and whilst our numbers may be viewed with envy by other DVCA clubs, they no doubt create challenges for those entrusted with such responsibilities. Ultimately however we all should have felt fulfilled to have had six senior grades play roughly 90 games over the course of the season.

Fielding six senior grades and requiring selection every week asked a lot of the respective captains and the match committee. Player availability was again variable and is an area that increasingly is where all clubs find themselves challenged as the concept of a 12 game a year player is a rarity (particularly in the lower grades). At times we were resigned to changing sides at the last minute as Covid-19 unavailability's impacted. An excellently organised junior program with willing youngsters and a wide network of past and part time players meant we always fielded full sides and this did the match committee, and the captain's enormous credit.

There were times where difficult decisions were arrived at and it is hoped that those impacted appreciated the communication and the thought processes behind any such decisions in what is always a difficult area to manage. Other challenges to be met included the fact that many XI's often were playing rivals higher XI's in their respective grades (C Grade and below). Particular mention must go to James McIntyre who ran a wonderfully informative colour coded spread sheet which assisted with both availability updates and the tracking of the profile of our XI's throughout the season.

A second year for the 1<sup>st</sup> XI in Barclay Shield under a new coach (Darren Pybus) and new captain (Nick Murray) brought with it a great many unknowns and a great many challenges. From the 3<sup>rd</sup> placed 2020-21 Barclay Shield side we lost 7 players and many of these were influential players within the side. These included former Coach Henry Tyler (Northcote & Philippines), Brent O'Connor (Retired), and Alex Lewis (Preston). In addition we also lost 3 younger players in Jack Arandt (Fitzroy), Spencer Veal (Riverside), and Callum Asbury (South Gippsland). All three were under 21 and had been identified as likely long term 1<sup>st</sup> XI players. Recruiting was undertaken and we added a batting all-rounder in Arky Cheema (Ivanhoe), a bowling all-rounder in Tom Hall (Mernda), and a bowler in Noah Ross (West Ivanhoe) who all made their 1stXI debuts in Round 1.

The season commenced in a forthright fashion with a stunning victory over reigning premiers North Eltham. A good lower order partnership (Willoughby & J Poyser) saw a defendable score reached, and from here an incisive bowling burst up front (Hannan) left North Eltham with too much to do at the end. What followed were indifferent successive defeats with no attributable theme against Rosanna and Macleod. From a position of relative comfort we then nearly saw Lower Eltham pinch a game, and only the safe hands of Wilson in the outfield saw a one run victory in the last over panic. The game leading in to the mid-season break therefore became an important one. What however followed was a powerful batting display by a well performed Heidelberg which saw the team back to 2-3 at the break.

The other side of the mid-season break saw a rousing and aggressive victory against perennial DVCA power side Riverside led by excellent individual performances from J Poyser and Cheema. The following three games however saw disappointing losses on the back of some indifferent batting, and after an angst filled day at Rosanna, an urgent re-set was required, particularly with finals out of reach and relegation a potential

hazard. Wholesale changes that included debuts for Lennox and Simon and a return to 1stXI cricket for Hartnett and Elmer added a bit of enthusiasm. A timely return to batting form for Murray saw a strong team orientated display upset Macleod. Another uplifting victory followed when the team bowled and fielded brilliantly after Lower Eltham started well in chasing a smallish total.

From here the season ebbed away and we were to lose twice, before drawing our final game. We ultimately finished 8<sup>th</sup> (of 10) at the end of the home and away season with five victories. Of the eight losses it was disappointing to note that only two of them were reasonably close encounters. Replacing the most impactful all-rounder in DVCA in Brent O'Connor (429 Runs & 26 Wkts in 2020-21), and an injured Michael Hannan after Round 7, was always going to be a challenge that tested the depth of the club. The results indicated that this challenge was not always met, even allowing for some wins against well performed sides.

The batting numbers were well down on 2020-21 and with only 14 individual scores over 30 it was a bridge the bowlers were not always able to defend. Only Arky Cheema, who finished the year with consecutive half centuries, Jeff Wilson (sensible in the mid order) and Nick Murray were able to reach 200 runs for the season. Of the others, Luke Poyser after a slow start shaped well until his season ended with injury. Similarly Joel Crook started slowly and found some semblance of form until his season also ended in late January. Justin Poyser who along with Nick Murray played the best two innings of the season. Both however would have been concerned with the number of times that they missed out. Bailey Neilson and Darcy Mills didn't quite progress as hoped but equally it is recognised that the one day format presents plenty of challenges for those relatively inexperienced at the level and required to keep the game moving.

The bowling was reasonably well performed when factoring in the losses at the outset and during the season. The highlight was undoubtedly the performance of left handed wrist spinner Arky Cheema who took 24 wickets and was a consistent wicket taker throughout. Another highlight was the niggardly economy of Tom Elmer who hadn't featured at the level for a number of seasons. Jeremy Mahar offered a point of difference with his pace and aggression and Michael Hannan (prior to injury), Nick Murray and Jeff Wilson bowled with good economy throughout.

Of the younger players Noah Ross and Ayush Simon had some encouraging games and both have scope for improvement. Congratulations should also go out to Arky Cheema, Tom Hall, Noah Ross, Daryl Kennedy, Ayush Simon, Connor Lennox, and Josh Neilson who all made their 1<sup>st</sup> XI debuts for the club during the season. It was the most players that had been introduced in a single year since 1988-89.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> XI under the leadership of Ryan Batchelder (and Ollie McGillion) was expected to challenge strongly after an impressive first season in B Grade in 2020-21 which included a 3<sup>rd</sup> placed finish. The challenge as always for a club 2<sup>nd</sup> XI is to gain results at the same time having the depth of talent ready to compete at 1<sup>st</sup> XI level. It is a compliment to Ryan that four players were able to earn promotion on the back of opportunity and performance at this level.

The side got off to an excellent start winning their first four games based on a formula of strangling sides bowling first, and then running down these totals with relative ease. Two losses either side of the mid-season break against other well performed sides in Heidelberg and Riverside was merely a stutter as they then proceeded to win their next three games. Winning and losing games decided by one run followed, and finals were virtually assured by Round 12 as a significant gap opened between the top four sides and the rest. Winning two of the final games saw a 3<sup>rd</sup> placed finish and a home final against Heidelberg. A convincing win chasing a modest total meant a clash away at Rosanna the following day for a Grand Final berth. What transpired was a strange and frenetic batting display (88) and although Rosanna were to lose 7 wickets in pursuit, the bowlers were left with too much to do, and the season was ended at the same point as it had done in 2020-21 with a 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish.

The batting acquitted itself well throughout. Ryan Hartnett (complementing his wicket keeping) and Ayush Simon led the way at the top of the innings and both scored over 250 runs. Michael Hannan playing as a bat due to a side injury made his first 100 amongst other robust contributions and Tom Hall, late in the year and Darcy Mills, earlier were well performed. Daryl Kennedy batted sensibly in support of others, and Ryan Batchelder scoring briskly, were both also important along the way.

The bowling effort was again highlighted by Josh Neilson who exceeded his previous years tally by one wicket (29). His ability to consistently take wickets when called upon was demonstrated by a strike rate of a wicket roughly every 22 balls. Ollie McGillion took 18 wickets and like Tom Elmer was very economical and gave the side excellent control. Connor Lennox was very influential, particularly early in the season, opening the bowling with his off breaks and Noah Ross finished the year as a consistent wicket taker and was desperately unlucky to miss out on playing in the finals.

Whilst disappointed at not reaching the Grand Final this side had a total of 27 players play including a number for the first time at the level. Importantly this XI gained further exposure to an intense level of cricket which will be of long term benefit to the club.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> XI under new captain James McIntyre were again competing in C Grade and often against other teams 2<sup>nd</sup> XI's. That they were highly competitive throughout was a very creditable scenario. In the early part of the season the side was able to threaten ultimate finals sides without quite prevailing. Three wins out of four games either side of the mid-season break was a promising sign. Unfortunately winning only one of the last six games cruelled any finals ambitions. Again a large contingent of players moved through this XI and among some older heads were a number of promising younger players from the junior section. A feature of James's leadership was his eagerness to involve the younger players in planning and preparing for games. The upshot was a side that was enthusiastic and willing to compete, and these youngsters were able to learn and think beyond their own games.

Runs were a currency that was slightly down from where it needed to be and there was only one half century scored during the season. Experienced pair James McIntyre (232) and Steve Pinner (196) were the only players to exceed 150 runs. Of the younger players, Joel Perugini, Zach Brown, Jake Lee, and James Heaney have abundant ability and were able to have an innings at the level that demonstrated that. Of the other more regular players, Paul Davis and Graham Bennett contributed well floating throughout the order.

With the ball James McIntyre had a tremendous season. Bowling later in the innings he was a regular and economic wicket taker with 20 wickets. Jaxon McIntyre bowling leg spin also showed ability at the level and had a taste of 2<sup>nd</sup> XI cricket along the journey. The more experienced Paul Davis and Philip Barnes bowled economically throughout and with their collective experience assisted enormously in the development of the younger fast bowlers. Of these youngsters Liam Sier, Nick Bowler Flynn Davis and Brodie Johnson all were able to break in to a finals bound B Grade Side during the year and only injury to Zach Brown prevented him developing as a bowler along with the others previously mentioned.

The 4<sup>th</sup> XI under Michael Delaney and Brett Oliver played in F1 and were again a well performed XI. The 'Peoples XI' started the year winning five of its first six games and there appeared a real gap in quality of opponents which may have flattered the side slightly. After the mid-season break the side was to win as many as they lost and it was a final round win that ensured a top four finish and a clash with F1 heavyweight Lalor. In a quirk of ill fate for Lalor, they were unable to host the game due to a fire damaged pavilion. On winning the toss they further compounded their woes by asking Banyule to bat and Lee & M Johnson did exactly that, sending the side on the path to a winning score. Unfortunately a listless performance the following day in the Preliminary final against Lower Plenty saw the side fall at the same hurdle and the same opponent as had happened in 2020-21.

The batting was generally able to score runs in a positive manner and the highlight was the development of Jake Lee who scored two half centuries in his 228 runs in what was his first year at the level. Dale Rodda, Michael Johnson and Sam Place all exceeded 150 runs in abbreviated appearances, and Michael Delaney exceeded 200 runs in his typically robust manner. With the ball veteran Peter Cargin with late swing was outstanding taking 21 wickets. Anish Jadhav and Daniel Murray both adjusted well to the step up in grades for them and exceeded 10 wickets, as did Brett Oliver who was the most economical. Brodie Johnson exhibited enormous potential and enjoyed exposure in both B & C Grades. One of the season's highlights was the outstanding wicket keeping of Graeme Renshaw. He was consistent throughout and made a number of fantastic catches including four in a game against Lower Plenty early in the season.

The 5<sup>th</sup> XI under the leadership of Alistair Howell played in F3 grade after a fixture amendment saw them promoted at the start of the season. After starting the year in a promising manner with two wins, the side experienced a severe downturn. Only one other win followed, and eight successive losses closed out what results and confidence wise was a disappointing year. What became apparent was that 40 players filtering through the side offered little by way of continuity and made planning difficult. Upon reflection it also became apparent that some of the younger players found the level of cricket a challenge particularly as most of the opponents were 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> XI's of their respective clubs.

Gavin Cochrane was an absolute stand out with 345 runs to complement his excellent wicket keeping. Nick Aston made some useful all round contributions and played a game in F1. Lindsay Russell was the leading bowler and his off breaks reaped 14 wickets. Ben Wilson and Leo Hobson-Nicholls both showed undoubted skill and promise with the ball and Josh Kapsalis and Thomas Kuriakose can also expect to develop their batting as they get more experience of senior cricket.

The 6<sup>th</sup> XI played in G2 grade and were led by new skipper Jamie Marks. The side was a mix of younger juniors (U14's) and cricketers and parents that are relatively new to cricket. This clearly contributed to results on the field that indicated a struggle. Like our 5<sup>th</sup> XI this side also found themselves matched up against sides that were a lot more experienced and stronger in all departments. The side was unable to make enough runs



to set competitive totals or stay in games and only Emilio Forsyth exceeded 100 runs for the season. Only Sterling Tuik who developed his slow bowling, and promising junior Nathanael Hetherington took more than 5 wickets.

An absolute highlight was the one win the side had against Grand Final side Montmorency. The lowlight was that it was the only game the first year skipper missed during the season! Other highlights included the amount of juniors that had their first taste of senior cricket.

A feature of having six senior XI's is the ability to transition enthusiastic juniors to senior cricket for the first time. Our junior players and participation rates as mentioned previously, are looked upon with envy by others. Not only are our numbers good but the abilities of some of these players stands out. We should be proudly aiming for these players to maintain their enthusiasm and to progress quickly through the grades as their talent develops further. Whilst success throughout the grades by way of wins did not always come during 2021-22, as evidenced by only two of our six sides making finals, we still have much to look forward to. A focus on retention and well targeted recruitment is a way in which we can ensure future success.
