CRICKET SEASON REVIEW

In the DVCA senior competition, Banyule was proud to field 5 senior teams, (Money Shield, D, E, F3 & G4 Grades).

In the DVCA vets competition (over 40's), Banyule was proud to field 3 vets teams, (Vets A, Vets B & Vets C).

In the DVCA junior competition, Banyule was proud to field 12 junior teams, ((U16s (x2), U14s (x3), U12s Competition (x4) and U12s Development (x3)). One of our U16 teams (U16 Red) was a joint team with Lower Plenty CC.

I am looking forward to next season as we build to ultimate success for our first grade team being 10years since our last A Grade Premiership which we celebrated this year with a reunion of this playing group.

I would also like to congratulate all premiership and individual award winners for helping make the year the success it was and with a special congratulations to Philip Barnes on achieving 700 wickets for our club, an astonishing achievement.

I was totally shocked at Presentation Night to be awarded the Don Richmond Award for continual service to our club and thank the club for making this presentation to me as I do not perform the roles for the purpose of achieving awards but do it because I love the club and respect its membership both past and present.

TREASURERS REPORT & FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BANYULE CRICKET CLUB INC,

The final result for the financial year ending 30 April 2019 was a surplus of \$8,724. This is a \$21,152 increase on the previous financial year deficit of \$12,427.

Revenue

Membership revenue increased by \$4,411. The increase is largely due to:

- Increase in t20 Blast fees (offset by higher costs) and participation
- Annual increase in membership rates.

Bar and Canteen recorded a \$12,730 gross margin, operating at 35% margin. This is an increase from last year. This is largely due to increase in sales, as a result of more senior teams, and hosting Money Shield Grand Final.

Sponsorship was up by \$8,312 from last year, largely due to increase in corporate sponsors, including Commonwealth Bank paying next season's fees up front. **Social Revenue** was down up by \$1,352 from last year. Decrease in Social Revenue was largely due to higher costs associated with presentation night, and slightly lower profit from \$2500 draw due to higher attendance (resulting in more bar costs).

Expenses

Cricket expenditure was in line with prior year spend. This is due to lower player payments and equipment costs, offset by higher match ball costs due to more teams and higher training costs.

New playing shirts were paid for this year for all senior and junior players, including for t20 Blast (covered by higher membership fees). Cost is estimated at \$15,000.

Last year, pitch replacement costs of \$18,000 were incurred, which were not incurred this year, largely driving reversal of last years surplus.

I'd like to send a big thank you to anybody who helped me along the way with running to the bank to get change, captains who were always chasing me to give me money, and everyone who paid their membership and everyone on the committee for their great work. It was great to see so much success on the field for the club.

Congratulations to first year coach, Henry Tyler, on a fantastic year as coach. The club is in great hands, and no doubt he'll be even better next year.

Looking forward to another successful season on and off the field.
