CRICKET SEASON REVIEW

In season 2013-14 the Club was proud to field 5 senior teams in the Diamond Valley Cricket Association (DVCA). Teams participated in Money Shield Grade, D, E, G Grades and the One Day Competition Grade. The Club entered 2 Senior Vets Team (over 40's) in the DVCA Vets A and Vets D Grades.

In the DVCA junior competition, Banyule was proud to field 7 junior teams in season 2013-14, (U18s, U16s [combined team with Greensborough CC], U14s x2, U12s Competition, U12s Development and U10s Joey's)

The club also ran another very successful Milo In2Cricket Program (ages 5-9).

84 players represented the Club in senior grades during the season. This was a long and extremely stressful period for the President Michael Asbury and I and we thank all club members, families and friends for their financial support of the club. Please see acknowledgements and further details below.

The club will also be forever grateful for the ensuing months of accounting assistance from Ian Cugley who spent many many unpaid hours auditing the club's financial records over a number of prior years. At the upcoming AGM on 3/9/14 the club will respectfully present to members details of the audited financial records and which will become the basis for a retrospective financial statement for season 2012-13.

The club's cash handling procedures went through complete overhaul during season 2013-14 and Michael Asbury is to be heartily congratulated for his leadership in this area, ably supported by new Treasurer Scott Clapton and Bar Manager Lucas Willoughby. The financial performance over last season is nothing short of sensational and provides the club with a solvent footing with which to focus on improving the club's cricket performance.

On the field the club was thrilled to win our first ever DVCA premierships, eventually collecting flags with our 2nd X1, 3rd X1 and Under 14 Teal side. This was a terrific reward for all round excellent performances from all coaches, junior managers and captains.

On an administrative front, the level of compliance and online deadlines in running a cricket club continue to grow as do the requirements asked by the association. Thank you to all captains who put up with me badgering them for completed scorebooks, umpires reports and all the necessities required to professionally record the performances of all teams throughout the year.

TREASURERS REPORT & FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BANYULE CRICKET CLUB INC.

The final result for the financial year ending 30 April 2014 was a surplus of \$18,934. This is a \$29,342 improvement on the previous financial year deficit of \$10,408.

Revenue

Membership revenue increased by \$13,225, primarily due to:

- an increase in financial members of 38 (\$4,420);
- increasing the junior membership fees by \$40 per player and senior concession by \$20 (\$2,720);
- capturing the costs charged to Vets members (\$1,820); and
- including Milo in2cricket members in revenue costs and revenue previously netted off offsets in higher cricket costs (\$4,425)

Bar and Canteen recorded a \$21,231 increase in gross margin, running at a mark-up margin of 78%.

Improvements in internal controls and cost capturing gave the ability to more accurately separate and allocated revenues and costs, and provide more transparency on bar margins.

Corporate Sponsorship was down by \$2,715 from last year, while *Social Revenue* was also down by \$2,173 from last year. Social revenue was lower largely due to the poorly attended Bogan Bingo night, which cost the club \$1,113 on the door.

The Gala Night held in August 2013 raised \$10,849 for the club. On behalf of the entire committee, I would like to thank everyone who attended and donated to the club. The night was a huge success, both financially and FUNancially, and will see the club in a great financial position in future years.

Expenses

Cricket expenditure was \$4,998 higher than last year. This was largely due to the separation of Milo in2cricket costs of \$4,525 which were previously being net-off against receipts. This can be seen by an increase in membership revenue attributable to Milo in2cricket of \$4,425.

Other factors contributing to higher expenditure were:

- hiring of bar staff every Saturday and for social functions (\$2,480);
- higher cleaning costs (\$937);
- higher ground hire costs (\$2,536).

I would like to say a special thank-you to our President, Mick Asbury, who did a lot of hard work at the start of the season in setting up better controls in our cash management. His hospitality experience proved extremely valuable. I would also like to thank Ian Cugley who gave me some guidance as to how I should best go about being treasurer, his years of experience were extremely useful.

Finally, a big thank you to anybody who helped me along the way with running to the bank to get change, captains who were always chasing me to give me money, and everyone who paid their membership and everyone on the committee for their great work. My first year as treasurer was a challenging one, so I really appreciate all the help and understanding that was given to me throughout the season.

Looking forward to another successful season on and off the field.
