CRICKET SEASON REVIEW

In season 2014-15 the Club was proud to field 4 senior teams in the Diamond Valley Cricket Association (DVCA). Teams participated in Money Shield Grade, C, D & G Grades. The Club entered 2 Senior Vets Team (over 40's) in the DVCA Vets A and Vets D Grades.

In the DVCA junior competition, Banyule was proud to field 6 junior teams in season 2014-15, (U18s, U16s, U14s, U12s Competition, U12s Development and U10s Joey's)

The club also ran another very successful Milo In2Cricket Program (ages 5-8) and T20 Blast Program (ages 8-9).

SECRETARY'S REPORTENTS

The club is pleased to present its 40th Annual Report for season 2014/2015.

The passing of Marty Veal has left a lasting shroud of sadness over the club. Most of the reports for this publication were contributed by respective coaches/captains etc. prior to Marty's passing, not least of which were Marty's own Junior Manager's report and also his review as coach of his U/14 side. Putting together this Annual Report has served as a surreal and painful reminder of the terrible loss we now all feel.

Early in the 2015/2016 season, the DVCA have agreed to fixture a home game for our 1st X1 against Heidelberg CC. This day will be used to raise awareness of mental health problems and the support services available. We appreciate Heidelberg CC's full support in this endeavour.

On the field the club faces a significant challenge this coming season with a restructure of the DVCA's 1st X1 divisions expanding to three from two. 3 teams are to be demoted from the top grade Barclay Shield into Money Shield and then a total of 6 teams to be demoted from Money Shield into the new 3rd division. This means the club will need to finish in the top 6 teams in Money Shield to at least remain in our current grade. Going on our results last season making the grand final there is no reason why we should not expect to finish high up in Money Shield if not win the premiership this year. We are very aware of many clubs utilising war chests of money to strengthen their line ups which has caused significant inflationary effects on player payments. The Banyule CC culture for a long time has strongly been about building sustainable juniors grades and promoting our own talent. It will be a very interesting year on the field but one we can face with confidence if we all commit professionally to getting the best out of every task ahead in the coming season.

Thank you to all captains and coaches who support me in adhering to the many (and it seems to be always rising) compliance tasks needed to operate the club. From correctly completing scorebooks, team sheet audits, having enough cricket balls, best & fairest votes, completing umpires reports etc, the list goes on to ensure the operational side of the club is run as smoothly as possible and minimise league fines.

Thank you to Ando for all your canteen work every Saturday. This is a huge commitment for which the club is always very grateful. Thank you also for your work as the club's resident historian and record keeper. The club records you put up each year always generate significant interest.

Thank you to Mick Asbury for a great 5 years as President. You've done a fantastic job and certainly not without some challenges along the way. There have also been great highs and a lot of fun. Well done.

TREASURERS REPORT & FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BANYULE CRICKET CLUB INC.

The final result for the financial year ending 30 April 2015 was a deficit of \$3,933. This is a \$22,911 reduction on the previous financial year surplus of \$18,879.

Revenue

Membership revenue decreased by \$5,723. For the second season in a row, membership prices were frozen in line with last year's prices. The decrease is largely due to fielding less sides:

- Lower senior membership largely due to one less side (\$2,440);
- Lower junior membership largely due to one less side (\$963);
- Lower in2cricket memberships (\$2,175);

Bar and Canteen recorded a \$8,809 reduction in gross margin, operating at 50% margin. This is a decrease from last year, and can be largely attributed to bar prices not increasing in 2015/16 season despite supplier costs increasing. Additionally, keg sales were replaced with premium and canned sales, which run at a lower margin.

Corporate Sponsorship was down by \$1,081 from last year, while **Social Revenue** was also up by \$3,230 from last year. Increase in Social Revenue was achieved due to all functions being profitable, plus running a Bunnings BBQ in preseason.

The Gala Night, which raised \$10,849 in season 2013/14, was not repeated in 2014/15, significantly contributing to reduction in surplus this year.

Expenses

Cricket expenditure was \$1,219 higher than last year. This is largely due to higher ball costs for the season, some of which will be carried over to season 2015/16 as stock.

Capital expenditure related to the extension of the clubroom deck, new junior bowling machine, new senior scoreboard, blower vac and deck blinds.

I would like to say a special thank-you to our outgoing President, Mick Asbury, who has certainly left the club in a better place than he has found it. From an accountability perspective, we now know a lot more about our finances due to the practices and systems Mick has been able to implement behind the bar over the last two seasons.

Finally, a big thank you to anybody who helped me along the way with running to the bank to get change, captains who were always chasing me to give me money, and everyone who paid their membership and everyone on the committee for their great work. It was great to see all the hard work of the club over the last few years finally translating into on-field success.

Looking forward to another successful season on and off the field.

COACHES' REPORT

For all six competitive senior and four competitive junior teams to play off in at least one final is an effort that everyone involved in the Banyule Cricket Club should be extremely proud of.

Saturday July 5th, on a fresh winter's morning at Beverley Road, began the campaign for season 2014/15, with our first pre-season running session. In and amongst this time, an Intra club match on the cabbage patch was held, and we loaded up the cars and travelled to Ballarat with two sides to play against the Ballarat Redan Cricket Club. We welcomed Michael Hannan back down to Banyule, and were introduced to new and exciting players in Nick Murray, Rob De Maria, Dale Wells and Jordan Prasad, all of whom positively contributed to our great club both on and off the field.

Training throughout our pre-season sessions and through 14/15 focused upon principles of simplicity. Improving catching and fielding, bowling disciplined and patient lines and learning to personally build an innings became central themes. We were extremely privileged to welcome Northcote champion Gerrard Dowling, Essendon Batting Coach Ashleigh Gannon and Assistant Footscray Edgewater Coach Duncan Harrison down to Banyule.
