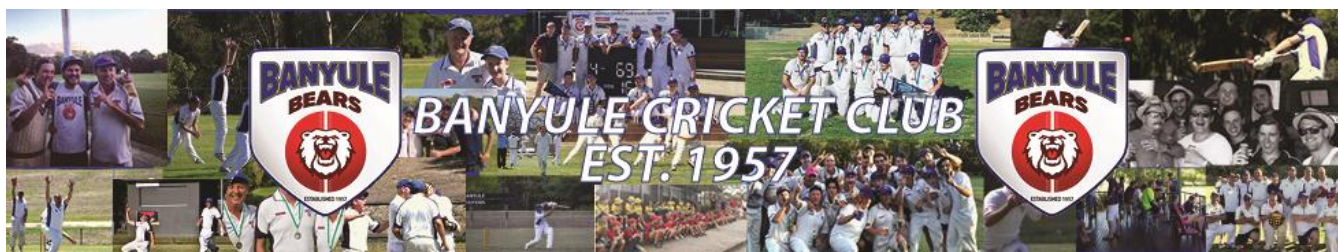

TREASURER'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BANYULE CRICKET CLUB INC,

The final result for the financial year ending 30 April 2025 was a deficit of \$11,598. This is a slight increase of \$970 on the prior years' deficit of \$10,628.

Revenue

Membership revenue decreased by \$9,135. This decrease was largely due to the reduction in the number of senior teams, with less senior playing members.

There were a number of Vets and Junior members who also played as part of the 6 Senior Mens' teams and T20 team during the year. Does not double count these.

Bar, Canteen & Dinners recorded a \$8,801 gross loss for the year. This was predominately driven by the late receipt of Foodworks invoices totalling \$11,126 that related to the prior financial year. Excluding these costs we would have made a surplus of \$2,325. Foodworks have changed their processes and management recently and this delay will not occur in future.

Sponsorship (net of function costs) was slightly up on last year however the second Cordon Event did not occur until after the end of the financial year.

Social & Fundraising Revenue was slightly up on last year driven by higher fundraising from the Toyota Good for Cricket raffle and slightly higher returns from our social events.

Grant income of \$21,639 provided some important income that supported some perimeter fencing mesh and a deposit on the new scoreboard.

The **Net Merchandising cost** was lower than last year because last year we provided free player shirts and some apparel to players with our new sponsors.

Expenses

Cricket expenditure was slightly lower this year, with lower player payments and incentives compared to the prior year. Also, expenditure on cricket balls was also lower with less senior teams.

Buildings and Grounds costs were significantly higher, predominately driven by the deposits paid on the scoreboard which was offset in the grants income.

Administration costs were slightly lower this year, with lower donations expense this year.

Depreciation and Amortisation is in line with the prior year and relates to the bowling machine, concrete slab, marquee and synthetic grass that were purchased three years ago. These capital costs are being expensed over the next 5 years of estimated useful life.

Despite recording a deficit for the year, predominately driven by the late receipt of the FoodWorks invoices relating to the prior year, the club remains in a sound financial position with \$35,987 of Cash at Bank. Thanks to all the captains and to the Junior and Senior Committee members who ensured the season ran successfully.

I would again like to thank Thea Oliver for her fantastic bookkeeping support again this year. This will be my last year of Treasurer, with Oliver McGillion taking over the role for next year.

Looking forward to another successful cricket season in FY25/26.

The committee has determined that the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial report is a special purpose financial report which has been prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with following Australian Accounting Standards:

Basis of measurement

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical cost and do not take into account changing money values except where specifically stated.

Statement of significant accounting policies

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Property

Freehold land and buildings are shown at their fair value, being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction.

Any accumulated depreciation at the date of revaluation is eliminated against the gross carrying amount of the asset and the net amount is restated to the revalued amount of the asset.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairments losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee members to ensure that it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Banyule Cricket Club Inc.**Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2025****Depreciation**

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, excluding freehold land is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready to use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

Plant and equipment	20%
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The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are recognised immediately in profit and loss.

When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation surplus relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

Impairment

At each reporting date the committee assesses whether there is objective evidence that a financial instrument has been impaired. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

Income tax

The association is a not-for-profit organisation and is exempt from income tax under section 50-45 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits, held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities cash within three months.

Revenue

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

Inventory

Inventory held for sale are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised inclusive of GST as the association is not required to be registered for GST. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

Banyule Cricket Club Inc.**Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2025****Borrowing costs**

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of assets that necessarily take a substantial period of time to prepare for their intended use or sale are added to the cost of those assets, until such time as the assets are substantially ready for their intended use or sale.

All other borrowing costs are recognised in income in the period in which they are incurred.

Trade creditors and other payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days on recognition of the liability.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in active market and are stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT - PLAYING REPORTS

After entering 7 senior sides in the 2023/24 season a practical re-set was arrived at as we approached the 2024/25 season. As a club we were significantly disappointed in the amount forfeits we encountered in our 6th & 7th XI's in 2023/24 which were entered into the one-day grade competitions (G Grade). We made representations to the DVCA that incorporated the idea of clubs losing points in their shield grade were a lower XI to forfeit.

Unfortunately, the competition appeared to prioritise the receipt of fines from the offending clubs rather than actively seeking to change behaviours that would promote the playing of intended fixtures. It was then determined that we would prioritise the placement of our playing XI's across the grades that are not exclusively one day grades in the hope that we would avoid the issues of 2023/24. The club ultimately determined that it would enter 5 sides and this was based also on an estimation of playing numbers as they presented in the lead up to the season.

As it turned out we could have certainly from the end of October onwards, comfortably entered a 6th side and we approached the DVCA with this mind before the Christmas break. Our offer to play for no premiership points in one of the lower grades that already had a scheduled bye was turned down and we then found ourselves in the strange situation of having to rotate (rest and manage!) anywhere from 10-15 players each week after players surfaced post exams, spring carnival and whatever other distractions were encountered in the early part of the season. Hindsight would suggest that in the seasons ahead we would be better served nominating an additional side and incurring a token fine on the rare occasion we may not field a side.

As in previous seasons the managing of our numbers requires an enormous amount of administrative organisation, from registration, merchandise and not to mention commitment from players at various stages of their cricketing journeys. It also requires enormous energy from the coaching group who must manage this and the expectations that go with it. To have upwards of 50 plus players training on any given senior night was an organisational challenge, albeit a pleasant one for the future of the club.

Particular mention must go to the senior coach Brent O'Connor and his 'numbers man' James McIntyre who handled this superbly. They were also supported by Jack Arandt and Jeff Wilson and they all ensured cricketing aspects were communicated and decisions and processes were well understood. About the only thing they couldn't control was the theft of copper which rendered our training facilities inoperable on a couple of occasions during the season.

The 2024-25 season represented an opportunity for the **1st XI** to consolidate on the progress made after a year in Money Shield. There was a degree of optimism as Money Shield has generally shown itself to be a very even competition over the past few seasons. Recruitment was limited to Kieran Keating from Montmorency and it was felt that any areas of deficiency would be covered off by the development of some of the younger returning players, but nothing is given and so it proved over the course of a fluctuating season.

How then to measure the start of the season? It wasn't until Round 6 in late November that a win was recorded and yet things never quite felt as dire as that. A narrow and ultimately season defining loss to Lalor when a controversial 'non catch' was claimed and upheld, was then followed by two narrow losses to Rosebank and Lower Eltham. The only really poor game was a trouncing received at the hands of Eltham in Round 2 and yet in late November a place at the foot of the ladder was a reality that had to be owned.

A solid run of performances saw three wins and a washout draw follow, and the mood at the season break was far more buoyant. The turnaround in performance was collective but the insertion of returning wicket-keeper Ryan Hartnett played no small part in this. For a group that has a somewhat passive personality type, his 'alpha' competitiveness coupled with his ability to communicate within the group was a vital support mechanism to Brent and for the team more broadly. It was no coincidence that the team was to only lose one of the six games he played.

The January resumption of fixtures, with only a game separating a finals berth or relegation battle set up an intriguing final five fixtures. Speculation suggested three wins would be enough. What followed was two wins, two draws (one weather effected and the other by virtue of vandals), and a poor loss to Montmorency. The upshot was a 5th place finish and a miss from finals by the narrowest of percentage margins. Having bowled eventual finalists Plenty out for 89 in the final round, it was later calculated that if we had passed them 3 wickets down that would have been enough to finish 4th. Unfortunately, a tense hard fought victory score of 8/90 lead by Jack Arandt was not enough to advance the season.

Only Julian Drohan (256 Runs), Brent O'Connor (250 Runs), and Connor Braniff (224 Runs) exceeded 200 runs for the season. All at various times suggested greater output but that is also an observation that could be

made for others in the batting line up along the way. Two players under 20 years of age in Jake Lee and Kieran Keating both made significant steps as the season progressed and can point to key contributions in the run chase against eventual premiers Rosebank, and individual performances of significant maturity against Greensborough and Montmorency, respectively. Justin Poyser also played with refreshing maturity when called upon later in the season.

The bowling is well regarded across the competition and offered points of difference. Jeremy Mahar (24 wickets) bowled a significant number of overs and led the attack in all conditions and never flagged. Brent O'Connor (18 wickets) continued to offer control and penetration whilst managing the odd niggles and he is to be congratulated for winning the Money Shield bowling award. Of the others, Leo Hobson-Nicholls (13 wickets) is a quick left armers who worried the opposition with his pace and has enormous scope for improvement. Jack Arandt with a pragmatic thought process to spin bowling, bowled with good economy particularly in the one-day games.

Congratulations should also go out to Kieran Keating, Jaxon McIntyre, and Tarun Ohri who all made their 1st XI debuts for the club during the season.

The 2nd XI in B Grade under the leadership of the experienced Jeff Wilson (and subsequently Justin Poyser and Cam Ataryniw) were anticipated to again challenge strongly at the level after consistent finals appearances in the recent past. The challenge as always for a club 2nd XI is to gain results at the same time as having the depth of talent ready to compete at 1st XI level. At times that challenge was comfortably met but unfortunately poor results in the early part of the season meant that it always felt like the side was playing catch up when it came to playing finals.

The response after not registering a victory in the first five rounds was to not register a loss in the next five games. This included an outright victory over a struggling Epping and this set the season up nicely to play finals. What followed was a poor loss to lowly Diamond Creek, and a loss to Rosanna when chasing a target, the local council found it timely to top dress the ground in the middle of a game! A fantastic victory followed against finals bound Riverside, and so it came down to needing to defeat Plenty and rely on other results. As it happened other results did not fall our way but nor did we play well enough to defeat Plenty making the final round fixture moot.

The batting was not always reliable in output but in Wahid Kazi (391 Runs) had a very consistent opener. Dropped to the 3rd XI early in the year he responded with an unbeaten 84* to earn promotion, and then a glut of runs followed. A thoughtful and determined cricketer who also sacrificed his game to keep wickets later in the year, he thoroughly deserved the Club Championship award. Justin Poyser (327 Runs) in 7 games was also an influential contributor both with his runs scored and also when captaining. A long time player at the club he finally scored a first ever 100 to the delight of all, and now that he is through that barrier could do so more frequently going forward. Liam Adair, Ryder McMurray, and Jake Lee from the younger co-hort also contributed significantly on occasions.

Daniel Murray (23 Wickets) with his hard-spun leg spin got good players out too often indicating he could and should aim to play higher. Cam Ataryniw (18 Wickets) always bowled with spirit and is at times awkward to combat. Anish Jadhav (16 Wickets) took a rush of wickets later in the year after returning from exams, and with his batting ability was close to 1st XI cricket. Tarun Ohri (10 Wickets), in limited games was also a real point of difference with his pace and energy and has been a significant addition to the playing group given that he arrived as a parent seeking the odd game.

A real positive aspect of this XI was its composition which saw 10 players aged 15-18 playing at various stages. There are some seriously talented players amongst them and often these players were influential within games which is a credit to them. In particular congratulations should go to Elvio Conceicao, Liam Adair, Ryder McMurray, and Jack Patena-McCarthy who played 48 games between them in the 2nd XI and also participated in the Under 16 Blue premiership team. Credit also to Jamie Marks who kept wickets very well and has made fantastic progress over the past seasons.

After competing against other teams 2nd XI's in D Grade the previous season the club sought to have the 3rd XI play in E Grade. This was also done when factoring in expected player depth. This looked a particularly wise strategy when, like the 1sts and 2nds, it took until Round 5 to register a victory. What however followed was a sensationally consistent run of form that was to see only one further loss until Grand Final day. The side was again led by the mature and understated Ollie McGillion. Around him were experienced performers at the level including Daryl Kennedy, James McIntyre, Paul Davis, Paul McMurray, and Peter Cargin so that when the turn in performance came it was likely to be sustainable.

Highlights were plentiful, but three narrow victories against Panton Hill, including a one wicket victory in a semi-final, and beating Lower Plenty immediately after the mid-season break were stand outs. The batting

was well performed with Ollie McGillion (338 Runs), Daryl Kennedy (300), Simon Adair (269), and Tom Braddy (264) all exceeding 250 Runs. In addition, Liam O'Connor made a high-quality century against Riverside to complement his developing wicket-keeping. The bowling was consistent and the highlight was the development of Ryan Forbes who took 21 wickets at the level and also played a handful of games in the 2nd XI. Ollie McGillion (15 Wickets), Peter Cargin (18), and Paul Davis (13) all provided excellent support.

The development shown by Ryan Forbes as an opening bowler and Tom Braddy as an opening batsman was particularly encouraging. Though Tom trailed off slightly, he made enormous improvement from the year before and showed he is a quick learner. Both these boys and Tom Kuriakose and Liam O'Connor who also played in the Grand Final are excellent young men who offer the club a really bright future. Aryan Mittal who played a handful of games at this level is also a serious talent for his age (15) and can expect to play higher in the years to come. Congratulations should also go to Daryl Kennedy for his first ever century and to Simon Adair for his commendable fighting half century in the tense semi-final victory.

The 4th XI under Steve Pinner (and Geoff Place), played in F1 and continued the variable trend by finishing at the foot of the table for the second year of the last three (with a Grand Final finish separating the two). This side was one of two Banyule sides in F Grade and this F1 Grade appeared to have a number of stronger XI's and often other clubs 3rd XI's. At the outset it was hoped that this side would be competitive and generally it was even if wins were scarce. The competitiveness was highlighted by the fact that the side was only bowled out twice during the season and on both of these occasions the score had already exceeded 200. On the flip side we were only able to take 69 wickets across 12 games. Defeating finals bound Research late in the year showed what was possible but too often variable availabilities throughout the club impacted this side the most.

The batting was highlighted by Steve Pinner (453 Runs) which included five half centuries and a run of 54, 90*, 92, & 70 to start the year. With the volume and tempo of his runs he was to deservedly win the F1 batting award and the Graeme Renshaw Medal. Of the others only Ash Gibson (154) exceeded 100 runs. In brief appearances (10 games between them) Paul McMurray, Aryan Mittal, Brett Oliver, & Jack Patena-McCarthy all contributed. With 39 players cycling through the side during the season it was often a case that the bowling depth was tested. When playing Josh Kapsalis showed undoubted skill and a good temperament with his left arm mediums. Jahan Dhruve bowled with at times with deceptive pace to complement his batting and wicket-keeping talents. Ash Gibson and Geoff Place performed well when also called upon in a tough year for F1 bowlers.

The 5th XI again played in F3 and was led by the experienced pairing of Alistair Howell and Graeme Renshaw. The side was a mix of an older playing group who prefer Saturday cricket over Veterans cricket (or combine the two) complemented by a mix of junior players and those of irregular commitments. It, like the other F Grade side also provided opportunities for several father-son combinations to play together. This side was highly competitive throughout the season and somewhat unlucky not to play finals after losing several games by very narrow margins. The season began encouragingly with four wins in the opening six rounds highlighted by high quality centuries to Garrick Melton and Thomas Elmer in wins over Lower Plenty and Riverside and combined five wicket hauls by David Veal and Brett Oliver in near unplayable conditions against Laurimar. Unfortunately, four narrow losses was a cruel way to end a season that contained many positives.

The batting was led by David Veal (335 Runs). David had an outstanding season and in partnership with Samuel Dennis frequently gave the side a solid platform to work from. In addition to his batting output David Veal (12 Wickets) was a good contributor with the ball. Of the others Brett Oliver (12) bowled with good economy but the highlights both were younger players Hayden McMurray (9) and Ayaan Ohri (7). Both showed much promise and with another Under 16 team member in Sahil Mittal, there is a lot to like about the young cricketers coming through. Significantly those three mentioned are also very good with bat in hand. In limited games fast bowler Brennan Davis and leg spinning all-rounder Mitch Mckellar both showed enough to suggest they will play higher in the near future.

As always it is a big club to manage but we have much to look forward given the platform established by Coach Brent O'Connor. A focus on retention, development and well targeted recruitment will help ensure future success.

2024/25 Banyule Women's Report

This season marked our first ever with a women's team. We started with a brand-new team of women, many of whom had never played together before. This included five women who were completely new to cricket: Jaime Hare, Olivia Barylka, Michelle Thomson, Caitlin Phipps, and Olivia Pucella. It was incredibly brave of them to step outside their comfort zones and try something entirely new.

As the season progressed, our team faced significant adversity, with our biggest challenge being a shortage of players. We often played with as few as 7 players on the field, requiring us to find fill-ins each week and frequently asking junior girls and their parents to play.

Despite these challenges, we were able to push through and win 5 out of 6 of our home and away games. This success propelled us into the finals campaign, where we won our first match against Camrea, scoring 4/96 to Camrea's 7/95. Notable performances included Bethany Cadusch taking 3 wickets for 13 runs and Tilly Reid retiring not out with 36 runs off 31 balls.

In our very first season, we reached the grand final against Heidelberg CC. Batting first, we scored a total of 115 runs, with Grace Lambert retiring not out on 36 runs off 40 balls and Isla Thomson contributing 30 runs off 49 balls. In the second innings, Heidelberg fought back strongly but ultimately fell short, thanks to excellent bowling from Grace Lambert (2/7) and Isla Thomson (2/15).

I am so incredibly proud of how hard these girls worked to accomplish such a marvellous achievement with so little prior experience. Their success truly comes down to the hard work each of these girls put in to get where they are.

The second half of the summer saw us move up a division, presenting a real challenge for the girls as they faced women with significantly more experience and established team cohesion. The team went winless during this part of the summer, however, this doesn't fully represent the achievements we had within it.

We celebrated our first-ever mother-daughter batting partnership with Kelly and Imogen Kingham, and we saw continuous growth and milestones across the board, with many women achieving personal bests, such as Olivia Barylka making her highest score.

Overall, the summer was very successful for the club and its players. Winning the Grand Final after starting as a brand-new team and overcoming player shortages is a testament to their resilience, teamwork, and the dedication of each player.

The second half of the season, while challenging, clearly fostered individual growth and created special moments for the team. Thank you to the club, scorers, fill-ins and everyone involved in the Banyule Women's cricket program! The future looks bright for 2025/26.
