SECRETARY REPORT

After 8 years as President, and Philip Barnes stepping down after 14 years as Secretary I took on the role knowing I had big shoes to fill. With Brad Bowler taking on the role as President we got to work.

One of our first actions was to invite Life Members Greg Anderson, David Veal and Geoff Place to develop a set of criteria that would be used to give guidance on awarding future Banyule Cricket Club Life Memberships. A big thank you to those gentlemen for taking on this all important task and developing a system that will be used in the future to measure and evaluate a nomination received by the Committee against a set criteria. Meeting the criteria requirements does not give automatic entry to Life Membership but will be used as an entry point for consideration.

This year we were fortunate to gain funding of \$46k to increase the concrete slab at our training nets which will provide a much improved space for our players ,especially during wet periods. This was due to a successful grant application being provided from the North East Link Community Fund which is made available to local communities impacted by the North East Link works.

We also ran another CPR/Defib course in which 14 members of our club attended thanks to a grant from the Victorian Governments Dept of Justice, Precincts and Regions. Those that attended found it was extremely helpful in developing or rebuilding on the skills to perform CPR. Let's hope they never have to use it. On behalf of the members of our club we thank the Victorian Government for making grants available in supporting local community not for profit clubs.

Funds were also made available via the Cricket Australia Infrastructure Fund to "double skin" our existing nets. This will them a safer area for all players and align with CA's Outdoor Training Facility Guidelines. We also improved the bowling machine net with the purchase and installation of " Soft Netting" to protect the operator of the bowling machine. These are just a few things that make our club a better place to be and we are hopeful of gaining funding to make further improvements to the training nets to improve their safety for users. All costs were a shared contribution of 50% each between our club and CA.

This year we reintroduced the awarding of the Graeme Renshaw Best and Fairest at the completion of the last round of Home and Away games which I hope will be continued as I believe it was a successful night. This award was won by our first grade captain Nick Murray with 17 votes. Congratulations to Nick and to all other award winners.

Our Vets form an integral part of our club. This year we introduced the Geoff Place Best and Fairest award as an acknowledgement of the work Geoff has put in towards a successful program run for over a decade now. Paul McMurray was the inaugural winner with 11 votes

I must also thank Brett Oliver for once again agreeing to look after all things MyCricket. This is a huge commitment to keep on top of all the selections, input of results, scorecards, clearances, transfers and anything else across the MyCricket platform. Next season will see the introduction of PlayHQ which will replace MyCricket along with a new Website. This will be a change for our playing group as they will be responsible themselves to register and pay membership and insurance fees before the season commences. Fingers crossed it all works out smoothly.

Whilst our Senior year was not what we expected, our juniors continued to show the way with 16 teams on the park. Eight teams made finals with four finishing with the ultimate prize. Our juniors are the future of the club and we must continue to support and develop this program led by Tim Braddy. Thank you to Darren Pybus for another solid year as Senior coach and I wish him all the best for the future and hope that he stays involved with our great club.

Our club has challenges on field going forward and this is the time we must ALL stick together and head in the same direction. We may not necessarily agree with decisions made both on and off the field but this is the time when we find those that are prepared to support the club and drive it forward and those that are not.

I thank the captains for helping me through the year by making their satchels available when requested so that they had the administrative items available when required. Finally thankyou to the committee for their work throughout the year with special thanks to members of the executive and to Philip Barnes for being available to provide advice when asked about secretarial item.

TREASURER'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BANYULE CRICKET CLUB INC,

The final result for the financial year ending 30 April 2023 was a deficit of \$9,770. This is a \$36,071 decrease on the previous financial year surplus of \$26,301.

Revenue

Membership revenue decreased by \$7,425. The decrease is largely due to a decrease in number of junior playing members.

There was no increase in the membership rates for FY22/23.

There were a number of Vets and Junior members who were required to fill the 5 Senior teams during the year.

Bar, Canteen & Dinners recorded a \$1,491 gross margin. Sales were down on last year primarily due to one less team. Also, operating from a different home ground did impact sales.

Sponsorship was down on last year by \$3,135 to \$14,550. We did welcome FoodWorks East Ivanhoe as a new sponsor this year.

Social & Fundraising Revenue was well up on last year by \$5,611 to \$9944. This is primarily due to the Toyota Good for Cricket fundraiser where we raised over \$4900 for the club. Also, two presentation nights were conducted this financial year.

Grant income of \$47,385 provided some important income that supported some major concreting works during the year. We were fortunate to receive a grant from the Victorian State Government – North East Link Program totalling \$46,361.90 for the concreting works extending the run ups in the cricket nets. We also received a grant of \$1023 from the Department of Jobs, Precincts and Regions that funded our CPR course again this year. Graham Clapton was once again instrumental in facilitating both of these important grants on behalf of the club during the year.

Expenses

Cricket expenditure was higher than last year, with higher player payments and incentives compared to the prior year and an increase in match and practice ball purchases and trophies with two presentation nights.

Buildings and Grounds costs were significantly higher this year and includes the new concrete works that was fully funded by the state government grant. Also, there was new synthetic grass and nets expenses incurred this year as part of the nets upgrade.

Administration costs were higher this year, with higher insurances, licensing and registration costs, iPads and card readers, as well as a donation made to the Viewbank Cricket Club Fundraiser.

Depreciation and Amortisation has increased this year. This relates to the new bowling machine, concrete slab, marquee and synthetic grass that were purchased in the prior year. These capital costs will be expensed over the next 5 years of estimated useful life.

Despite a challenging year, it was a fantastic effort by everyone who participated. Thanks to all the captains who manage weekly collection of umpire fees and to the Junior and Senior Committee members who ensured the season ran successfully.

Finally, I would personally like to thank Thea Oliver for her fantastic bookkeeping support again this year.

Looking forward to a successful cricket season in FY23/24.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT - PLAYING REPORTS

The playing group under second year coach Darren Pybus were able to plan in the knowledge that a return to relative post Covid19 normality beckoned. Early indoor training for the likely Shield group was held at Cutting Edge in Bundoora, before being extended to the rest of the group as the season approached. Other training endeavours saw fitness and fielding sessions on weekends some players also gathered in small groups and utilised local facilities where time permitted.

As with pre Covid19 cricket in the DVCA, fixtures for 2022-23 reverted to a mix of two day cricket (80 overs for Barclay Shield to E Grade, and 70 overs for F Grade) and one day cricket (40 overs for Barclay Shield to E Grade, and 35 overs across all other grades). Prior to the seasons commencement it was decided to field five (5) senior sides and forego the 6th side from 2021-22. This was a decision was not easily arrived at but early indications were that our senior playing numbers were likely to be down on the previous season, particularly across the 30 year old co-hort.

Whilst we have excellent and willing numbers across our junior program who have already had some exposure to senior cricket, there were some considerations that needed addressing. Primarily we had to factor in that juniors playing senior cricket need to be playing with other senior players. The concept of selecting juniors en-masse and not surrounding them with adult leadership to assist in game day basics did not sit well with the club, particularly when the club had senior sides that were graded a touch higher than our expected talent was going to come up against.

To this end a selection criteria was arrived at to ensure opportunities were shared and that when these opportunities came the young players were well supported in what can be a challenging environment. At the end of the season the Match Committee can be said to have done an excellent job in co-ordinating our willing juniors and network of past and part time players to ensure that we always fielded our five senior sides. At some points we were even oversubscribed. Fielding five senior sides is the envy of many clubs we play against even if the 2022-23 season was challenging in terms of results. Particular mention must go to James McIntyre and Alistair Howell who assisted with both availability updates from the juniors and the tracking of the profile of our XI's throughout the season.

A third year for the 1st XI in Barclay Shield was a chastening one. Continuing an unhealthy trend from the previous year we were to either lose key players entirely or lose them for extended portions of the season. This was coupled with a recruitment drive that didn't quite 'net out' as we had hoped and meant that a tough campaign was not unexpected.

The season commenced with a one dayer against Rosanna. At various stages we were well placed before falling away with the bat in the run chase. As with all grades a near month of wash outs followed and when it came to a resumption we were competitive and at times in good positions against North Eltham and Riverside in the two day games that followed. Our lack of batting depth across 80 overs perhaps not unexpectedly influenced those games. What followed were indifferent successive defeats with no attributable theme against Epping and Heidelberg.

A vital fixture against fellow strugglers Research became a 'must win' game to keep the relegation talk focused elsewhere. The batting performance was slightly 'unders', the bowling performance was listless and accompanied by some rancorous behaviour the loss became a damaging inevitability. The following game, a return fixture against ladder leader Rosanna, was even more damaging. A brilliant bowling display to dismiss Rosanna for 71 should have seen a much needed win banked. Instead we could only muster 62 in response and with it a gap in ladder position in relegation battles was confirmed. To the credit of the side a narrow hard fought loss away at Epping was encouraging after the games that preceded this.

With three games remaining and the likely need to win all of them, our challenge was snuffed at the first effort against Diamond Creek who comfortably defeated us outright. Rosebank continued the pain in the following fixture winning on the first evening. A spirited final game saw a narrow loss to finals bound North Eltham and concluded what was a winless campaign and an invitation to play in Money Shield for 2023-24.

The batting numbers told their own story with only 13 individual scores over 30. It was a damning statistic given the fixture comprised six two day games. Ultimately it was a bridge a game bowling attack was unable to cross. Only Nick Murray (289), and Julian Drohan (210) were able to reach 200 runs for the season. Of the others, Connor Braniff in six games showed some pleasing ball striking and Justin Poyser played responsibly in the lower middle order after his late season return. First year player Basim Khan played some good innings but too often failed in a side that needed more from him. Nick Murray scored his second 1st XI century and also made an excellent 59 to go with his 6 wickets against Riverside to win the batting award. Julian Drohan, a 19 year old all-rounder, showed outstanding competitive qualities in a struggling side and his batting technique should see his numbers improve.

The bowling performed about as well as expected when factoring in the losses at the outset of the season. The highlight was undoubtedly the performance Nick Murray who took 24 wickets, absorbed a heavy workload, and was a consistent wicket taker throughout. Julian Drohan bowled a 'heavy ball' and took 16 wickets in a spirited display. When available Tom Elmer bowled intelligently and with good economy. Jeremy Mahar offered a point of difference with his pace and aggression but perhaps needed more overs. Without a recognised front line spinner, Lucas Willoughby performed credibly.

Of the younger players not previously mentioned, Jake Lee and Josh Neilson showed encouraging signs in limited opportunities and both have scope for improvement. Congratulations should also go out to Flynn Davis, Connor Braniff, Jackson Bowler, Julian Drohan, Basim Khan, Jake Lee, James McIntyre, and David Perrow who all made their 1st XI debuts for the club during the season. It was the most players that had been introduced in a single year since 1981-82 (equal with 1988-89).

The 2nd XI in B Grade under the leadership of first time captain Connor Lennox was anticipated to again challenge strongly after a number of consecutive finals appearances. The challenge as always for a club 2nd XI is to gain results at the same time having the depth of talent ready to compete at 1st XI level. Unfortunately the side struggled to field settled line ups and at times was a little lacking in the necessary experience to push through in tight games with four of the losses narrow enough for reflection on what might have been. Successive wins either side of Christmas were to be the high points.

The batting was underwhelming throughout with only three players tallying more than 100 runs for the season. Jake Lee (183), playing two grades higher than the previous season played well as an opener and James McIntyre (169) after returning from knee surgery showed his quality to match his experience. Connor Lennox (12) led the wicket tally and bowled his off spin with good economy. New player Nikhil Sawant bowled his zippy mediums with great effect and Brodie Johnson and Leo Hobson-Nicholls adapted well to the step up in level.

The 3rd XI under returning captain Paul Davis were again competing in C Grade and often against other teams 2nd XI's. A tough season was anticipated and so it proved with only two wins achieved. A number of heavy losses meant that a final round game against fellow struggler Laurimar would determine who would remain in C Grade. Unfortunately a loss followed and the reality of playing D Grade lies ahead which may not be a bad thing for the profile of the side that played this season. Again a large contingent of players moved through this XI and among some older heads were a number of promising younger players from the junior section.

Runs were at times hard to come by with only the experienced pair Paul Davis (229) and Bill Sier (209) exceeding 200 runs. Both are still impactful players at the level. Of the younger players, Liam O'Connor showed a good technique in the top order and fought hard. Daniel Murray also made some valuable contributions lower down. With the ball wickets were hard to come by with only two players exceeding 6 wickets for the season. Daniel Murray (10) showed improvement and was rewarded for his training endeavours. Ben Wilson also showed out in his first time at the level and Liam Sier when available displayed his obvious talent.

The 4th XI under Alistair Howell and latterly Brett Oliver, played in F1 and were winless across the whole season. This was a stark reversal for an XI that has consistently played finals over the past decade. A narrow loss late in the season to eventual premier Lower Plenty was perhaps the best performance and a last ball loss to Bundoora United its unluckiest. The reality was that the level of cricket asked too much of the players across the duration of a game. For portions of the game players were able to defend well with the bat or hold the game up with the ball, but when a game turned it did so decisively. With only Graeme Renshaw and Brett Oliver (occasionally) remaining from the 2021-22 season this was not entirely unexpected.

The batting was highlighted by Ryder McMurray (216) which included a first senior century. In his first full senior year he was able to physically compete and play positively. His results will further improve when he relaxes and understands the tempo of the game and the impact he can have. His bowling is also very promising and he should fully expect to progress through the grades quickly. Stevie Taylor also fought hard with the bat as an opener and late in the season Declan O'Connor played with a bit of flair and looks very promising. Nick Aston really came on as an opening bowler. He moved the ball and rarely bowls short so he is always in the game and thinks deeply about what he is doing. Of the others Jack Patena-McCarthy and Harrison Stephens-Block showed good ability with the ball and should further develop. In a side that often had a higher percentage of under 17 year old players perennial veteran Graeme Renshaw kept wickets tremendously throughout.

The 5th XI played in G1 one day grade and were again led by Jamie Marks. The side was a mix of younger juniors (U14's) and cricketers and parents that are relatively new to cricket. This clearly contributed to results on the field that indicated a struggle. Like our other XI's this side also often found themselves matched up against sides that were a lot more experienced and stronger, though the season results indicated a relative

improvement from the previous season. This was perhaps attributable to games when our experienced players turned out together.

The side was generally pretty well performed with the bat. Luke Ryan (217), a junior parent playing for the first time for a number of years batted with great consistency. Marlon Schoen (166) opened and placed great value on his wicket and also compiled a first half-century. Of the other regular players, Simon Adair and Ashish Mittal made good contributions. With the ball Marlon Schoen (11) and Shadi Haila bowled with great consistency. Tom Braddy (9) with his nagging steady left arm length and decidedly sharpish Patrick Donehue (7) showed out. Of the very young members of the side, Liam Adair and Darcy Pinner both played well in their first year of senior cricket and both also played higher later in the season.

Whilst success throughout the grades by way of wins did not always come during 2022-23, it no way diminished the efforts of our coach Darren Pybus or club captain Nick Murray. Darren advised he would be finishing up near the season end and I am sure the playing group appreciated what he was able to provide. We were also advised that Nick Murray was going to transfer to another DVCA club in Barclay Shield. Whilst disappointed to be losing him we thank him for his 8 years at the club. In that time he has fulfilled a number of roles inclusive of social and merchandise roles in addition to playing and latterly as club captain.

We do however have much to look forward to with the return of Brent O'Connor as playing coach. A focus on retention, development and well targeted recruitment is underway and will help ensure future success.

JUNIOR SECTION (SUMMARY & AWARDS)

JUNIOR REPORT

Season 2022-2023 proved to be a very successful time for the Junior Program at Banyule. IN all, 16 teams took the field in maroon and blue. This included five U10 teams, five U12 teams, three U14 teams, two U16 teams and one Division 2 Girls team. This impressive number meant that 165 players, which proved that Banyule Cricket Club was able to buck the trend of other local sports and retain more than 90% of its numbers in the post-COVID environment. The junior committee attributes this achievement to our junior mantra, that we prioritise participation and give every child a chance to improve their skills. We believe that we appoint the right people into coaching and team manager positions.

Many thanks to the Junior Committee. They continue to work for the benefit of the club and its players. James McIntyre has driven registrations and organised trophy winners while taking a keen interest in junior pathways to representative cricket and juniors playing senior cricket at Banyule. Steve Pinner, while also taking a keen interest in assisting with junior players finding places in senior teams has continued to drive our Cricket Blast program and has overseen the U14 teams. Like he needed something else to do, Steve also took over the contribution of junior content on the BCC social Media pages! Brent O'Connor has spent times with all age groups by providing advice and specialist coaching while overseeing the U12 program. Simon Ross has stepped into the U10 Coordinator role and has done a magnificent job in ensuring our smallest Bears and their coaches have felt supported with communication and equipment. Cam Heaney has steered the U16 teams in a similar vain. We are also thankful to the main committee for their interest and support, led by president Brad Bowler and secretary Graham Clapton.

Mandy Bland willingly took the role of **Child Safety Officer** for the season and brought with her expertise and professionalism from her past experiences on the board of the Victorian Child Abuse Inquiry. The club should feel fortunate to have such parent volunteers with specific expertise and willingness to share their skills. Mandy was an excellent liaison between Cricket Victoria, our coaches, team manager and committee. Fingers crossed she continues to advise our club in the seasons to come.

Steve Pinner continues to serve the club as **Cricket Blast** coordinator with drive, even though his own son is now U14! Steve employed a range of young Bears to help this season and had an enrolment of about 25 blasters. He believes that the club's temporary move to Banyule Flats may have hampered numbers, being a less visible centre. Perhaps a move back to Beverley Road next season will help drive numbers back towards 60+ that has fuelled the junior numbers in past years.

Huge thank you to all the **volunteer coaches and team managers**, who are the real driving force of the Banyule juniors. Many of them are parents, with a couple of interested senior cricketers. Every coach experienced a positive season, and most have already expressed a desire to continue their commitment into Season 2023-2024. I am hopeful that we can increase the numbers of seniors that invest time in the junior program in some capacity. Coaching full time is a big commitment, however seniors being involved in some junior training sessions and watching games occasionally helps to bridge the chasm between the senior and junior sections. A move back to Beverley Road will also help this next season.

There were some **frustrations** from the season. Most notably, a lack of two-day cricket for our juniors despite a year free of lockdowns. Only two two-day matches were fixtured, and it is our hope that the DVCA becomes more inventive with future fixturing so that our juniors can develop understanding of what it is like to build an innings beyond 20 over cricket. Ground allocations also continued to be a source of frustration, with no coach wanting a 'home' game out at Anthony Beale Reserve in St Helena; however, that continues to be a by-product of our success. The other major frustration was the selection process for DVCA representative sides. We trust that it will become more transparent next season.

Banyule players won three awards at the **DVCA presentations**. While small numbers of our players on such lists, it is indicative of our policy to ensure that our players have equal opportunity in each team. We congratulate Harry and Anish on their achievements:
